Falls City Excursion.

The first excursion of the season was made to Falls City Sunday. It was conducted by the Independence & Monmouth Railroad company and the trip made in a newly painted and fitted up coach. The excursion car was in charge of W. G. Cressy and the occasion fell on the 50th anniversary of his introduction to the railroad service. Conductor Cressy began his railroad career as brakeman on a New Hampshire road in 1853 and with the exception of short intervals, has followed the calling ever since. A small party boarded the car at Independence, a few more were taken out at Monmouth and the addition at Dallas made all the car would comfortably accommodate. At Falls City the band was out and a pleasant outing was afforded the visitors. Bowers of dog-wood blossoms were brought back as trophies of the occasion.
