Local Option.

Dr. G. L. Taffe who lectured in Polk county on local option last week said to the West Side Enterprise for publication: "This is a non-partizan measure to give the people home rule upon the saloon proposition; to remove the responsibility from the town council to the majority vote of the citizens. But will it not affect the hop culture of the state? No, because nearly all the hops are shipped to London and the Eastern states Oregon breweries cut a small figure in the demand for hops, besides no one expects to see them put out of business. This last will confine the saloons to the business wards in the cities. What are the prospects of the bill being carried? Very good indeed. People even who drink believe it to be a fair proposition and a just law. At present the farmer has no voice in the town saloon and derives no revenue from it. Yet he must pay additional taxes as a result of the traffic. The shooting affray at Corvallis would have cost the farmers several thousand dollars had the young man been taken alive. This law will give the taxpayers a voice at the polls to decide whether the traffic shall continue in their locality."
