Man from Willamette Valley to Spend their Vacation at the Sea Shore.

Hundreds from the Willamette Valley spent their vacation at North (Long) Beach, Washington, last summer, and it is safe to say that this popular resort of the North Pacific Coast will be visited by many more this year than ever within its history.

The trip on the Willamette and Columbia rivers, out of Portland, is one long to be remembered, the usual heat of a summer afternoon being tempered by a gentle breeze freighted with the aroma of pine trees and seasoned with salt sea air.

One hour from Astoria through the famous fishing waters of the Columbia, past scores of salmon traps and nets and as many white-winged fish boats, the passengers at Flavel's Bay, where connection for beach points is made with trains of the Northern Railway.
