Grangers and Hop Men will Hold a Picnic and Convention at Independence June 24 and 25.

Governor Chamberlain and Other Prominent Speakers to Take Part.—State Agricultural College Co-operates.

The Grangers and Hop Men's Picnic and Convention at Independence 24th and 25th will be a hummer.

Arrangements are now well under way. There will be night and day sessions. Governor George E. Chamberlain will address the people at the picnic on Friday.

The evening and afternoon sessions will be in charge of Dr. James Withycombe, assisted by others of the faculty of the state agricultural college. Prominent farmers, specialists in their line, will give the people the benefit of their experience. The leading hop men of the coast will be heard from.

Many prominent visitors will be present. Contests and sports of various kinds will be provided. Such men as Arthur Moore, Verd Hill, George Kutch and Wm. Barrett, comprise the committee on sports. Music, vocal and instrumental will be interspersed throughout the program. Basket dinners

will be served on both days being spread in the beautiful grove west of town.

It will be a big picnic and convention. June 24 and 25 are the days.

AN ANCIENT RELIC.

James Alexander, a native Kentuckian, but for many years one of Polk county's most stable citizens, has favored this paper with a copy of the Boston Gazette of March 12, 1770. The paper is yellow with age and is ready to fall to pieces, but the print is still discernible and it is full of matter of historic interest. The issue is devoted largely to reports of meetings being held at that time in Massachusetts resolving against the use of imports from England as long as tax was imposed on tea and to protests against the quartering of troops among citizens in times of peace. One page bordered in mourning is given to accounts of clashes between the soldiers and citizens, and killing of citizens and boys that aroused the blood of the Revolutionary fathers, and makes interesting reading yet.

Mr. Alexander also brought with him from Missouri a pair of bullet and buckshot moulds which furnished the leaden missiles for the Revolutionary war.
