## ROOSEVELT ELECTED

Twenty-fifth President of U.S. Receives Largest Vote Ever Give Presidential Candidate

THE INDEPENDENCE NATIONAL BANK Gets All Doubtful States, Breaks Into Solid South and Will Have 343 Votes In Electorial College

Exceeded All Expectations.

The vote for Roosevelt Tuesday exceeded all expectations. Early, in the evening Judge Parker, the democratic candidate wired his opposent:


"The people by their votes, have emphatically approved your administration, and I congratulate you".

Roosevelt not only carried all states that had been listed as doubtful, but broke into the "Solid South" and carried Missouri, along with Folk, democratic candidate for govenor.

The plurasity for the republician candidate will be in the neigh borhood of 1,800,000. The nearest approach to this was in 1896 when McKinley received a plurality of 850,000. Grants was the next higest plurality 762,991, received in 1872.
