

The 1904 Hop Yield

The latest estimate on the Oregon hop crop for this year is ere today 85,000 bales. While this year's Railroad crop falls short of the 1903 pron freight duction, the revenue derived from om \$25 to it exceeds that of 1903 by more than \$1,000,000. The price received last year did not go aboye aintained, 15 cents while this year the bulk in Polk of the crop sold for prices ranging from 25 to 30 cents.

Oregon produces more than onethird of the entire hop yield of the United States. Putting the ayerage price received for this year's crop at 25 cents the income will be close to \$4,000,000.
