### CORVALLIS EDITOR ERRS.

The Corvallis Times says that the Enterprise labeled the students of O. A. A. "thugs." We will take it for granted that the Times man was basing his statement on what had been said to him. For his benefit we will say that he is mistaken when he thinks that this paper called all the students in the O. A. A. thugs, for that was our last intention in the Times. Our intention is the Times' own correction when he thinks that this paper was roasting the college because of our fondness for Dallas. We have no feeling either way as far as the two schools are concerned and a well conducted game of basket ball, hotly contested though it might be, would be just as interesting to us if Corvallis won as it would if Dallas did likewise. The school is not to blame if some well meaning parents have made a mistake and sent their boy, or boys as the case may be, to college when they should have been sent to the reform school. We received a copy of the Barometer of February 22 with three places marked where there was allusions made to conduct that must have been ungentlemanly to say the least; one of which reads as follows: "The conduct of certain upper-class men at the annual freshmen banquet, merits the severest reproach." The other two were still worse, one of which refers to the conduct of those connected with the basket ball game. We believe that the Agricultural college is doing a great deal of good, yet it can do a lot of harm in a short time by allowing persons to remain inside its walls who are guilty of such infractions of the law of good society. Let us hope that the Times will "get next" and see the error of its ways before the people get the idea in their heads that things are not conducted properly at the college and hold up the appropriation. What we want to see is the college cleared of the undesirable element that seems to have secured a footing there and then have a larger appropriation made for the benefit of those who go there to get a practical education.

### Aged Pioneer Passes Away.

David Johnson died at his home in this city Saturday morning March 7th, aged 92 years, two months and 24 days. Mr. Johnson was born in North Carolina December 12, 1815 and came across the plains to Oregon in 1844, being one of the earliest settlers in the state, settling on a donation claim of 321 acres. His first wife's name was Arminta Tharp, who was the mother of three children, Richard, Angeline and Charles. His second wife was Loretta Webb, who was the mother of one child, Mrs. Annie Hooper.

Mrs. Loretta Johnson died March 7 1900.

Mr. Johnson had been an invalid for the past ten years and was taken

care of by his grandson Fred Hooper, who was always kind and patient with him.

Thus it is that one by one the old pioneers are passing from the scene of their labors, where they have laid the foundation of a mighty empire that will endure for ages. Peace to their ashes. May they never be forgotten.
