NORMAL SUMMER SESSION

Preparing for Work---Ressler
on Eastern Tour.

President Ressler left last week for the east; he will visit for a day or so in Omaha at the home of his brother, and will then go to New York City directly where he will enter Columbia College in the college for teachers at Morningside Heights. He will then visit at a number of the leading normals before returning here. His purpose is one of research and study and he will approach the school question from the viewpoint of the best methods and their adaptability to work. From letters received he is enjoying the trip and expects to return about the tenth of June.

On Friday of last week W. A. Ayer, of Portland, and Superintendent Ackerman visited the Normal and occupied the time while here in going over the building and grounds and attending the class work. These gentlemen are members of the Board of Regents for normal schools. Superintendent Ackerman conducted some recitations and the visit was one of interest to the students.

Mr. Traver spent last week in an institute at Astoria and his institute work will call him away each week for the rest of the term. He is an enthusiast in this work and his services are in great demand.

Preparations are taking definite shape for the summer session of the Normal and the instructors have been engaged. President Ressler and Mr. Traver have carefully planned the course to accommodate the greatest number of teachers wanting such work and in the four courses given can be found outlines for all the grades. They have spared neither time nor expense to secure the best and when it is stated that Supt. J. A. Churchill of Baker City and Supt. F. B. Cooper of Seattle will each conduct a course it is a sufficient guarantee to all that it is well worth while. These men all know the work from a practical as well as a theoretical point of view and no one will regret the time used in getting this work.

The tennis club has been organized and a committee appointed to prepare the courts. The membership was increased by the addition of some eighteen names. The club is arranging for a schedule of games with neighboring towns and the promise is for some well contested tournaments.

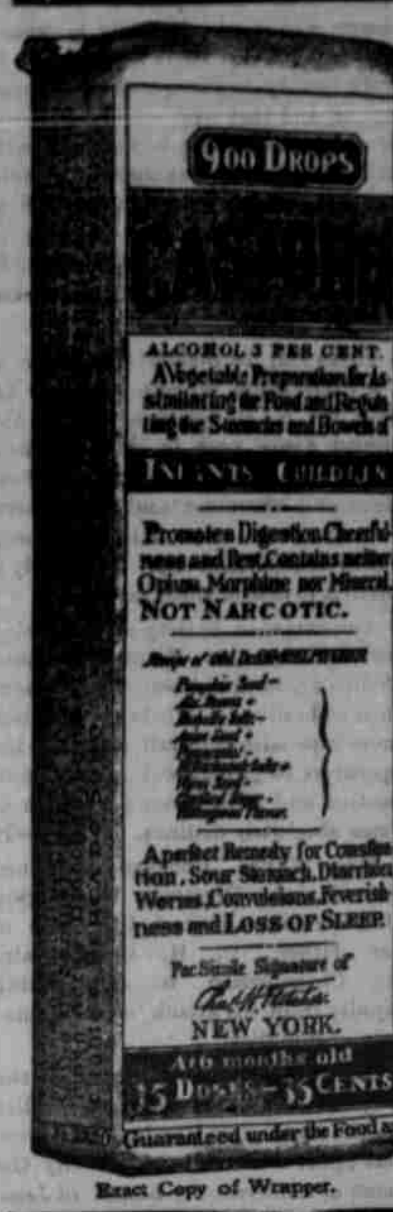
