Dan P. Stouffer

FOR COUNTY TREASURER

One of the most capable men ever nominated in Polk county for the office of county treasurer is Dan P. Stouffer, the Republican candidate in the present contest for that office. He is a man of fine clerical ability, and as an expert bookkeeper and accountant he has no superior in the county. Mr. Stouffer was city auditor of Dallas for many years and his office records and account books were models of neatness and accuracy. During all of the years he filled that office, not one cent was lost by the city through error or carelessness, and when the important suit was brought to condemn a right-of-way for the water works pipe line, the auditor's records, which had been strongly attacked by the opposing counsel, were found to comply with legal requirements in every particular, and it was these perfectly kept books that aided largely in the brilliant victories in both the Circuit and Supreme courts.
