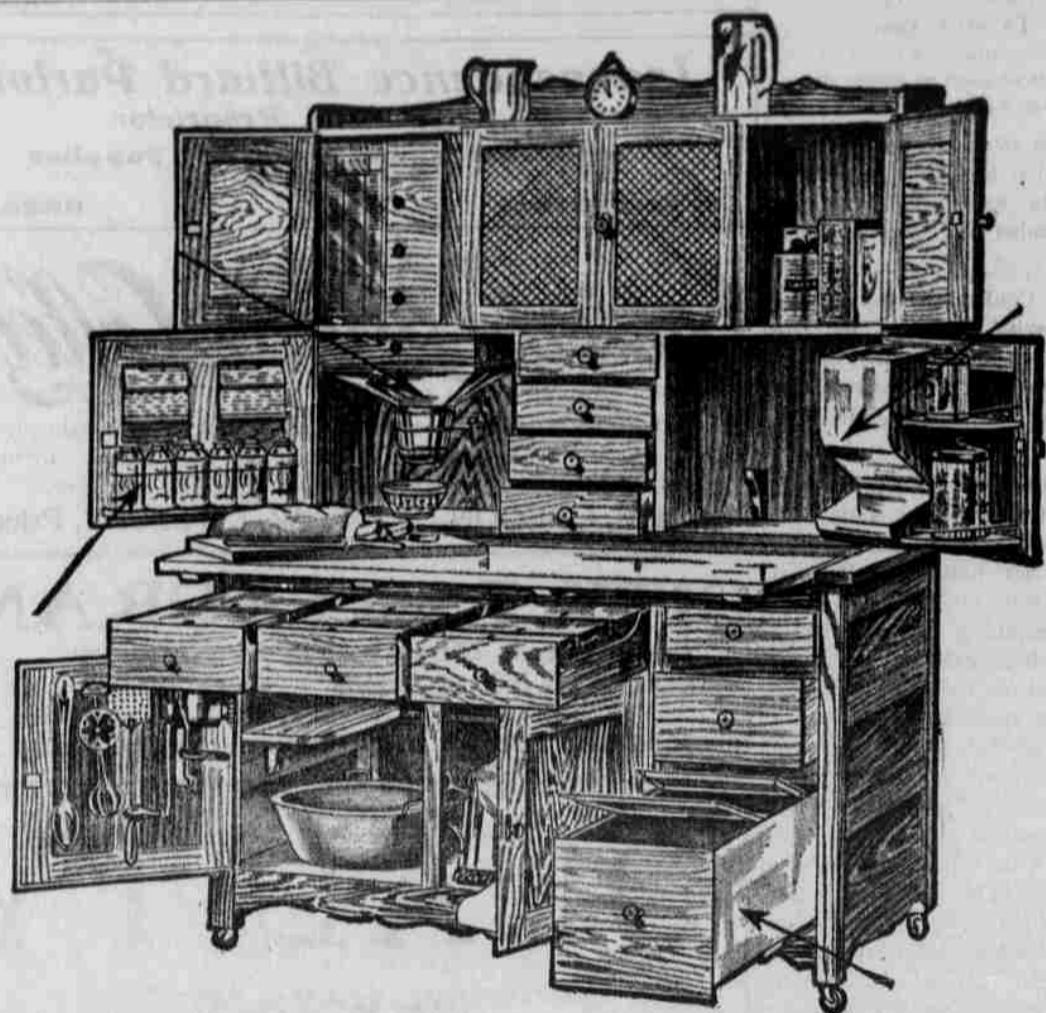

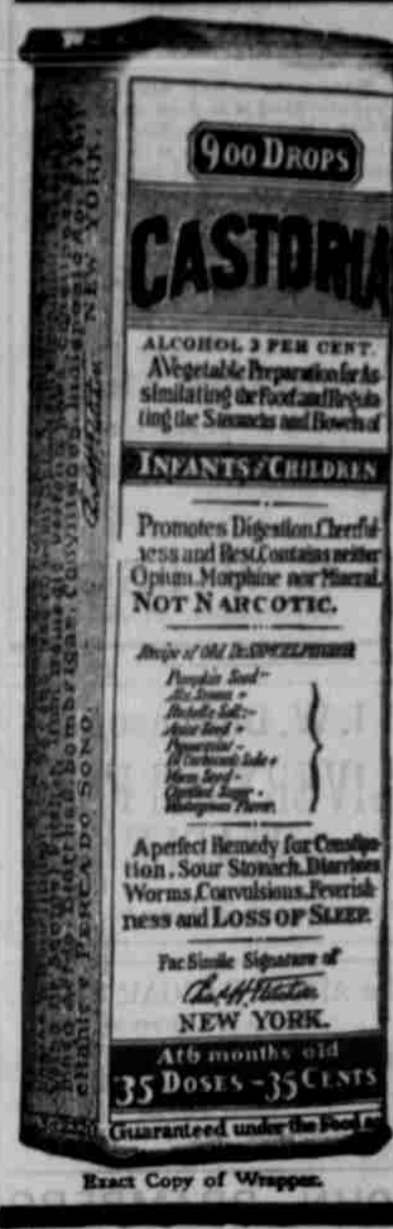
George Govro, who resides with his
