INDIANA.

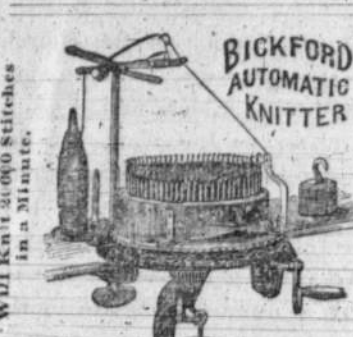
