The Sun Streamers and Comets' Tails.

We cannot but think that the true explanation of these streamers, whatever it may be (we are not in the least prepared to say what it is) will be found whensoever astronomers have found an explanation for comet tails. These singular appendages, like the streamers seen by Prof. Abbe, extend directly to the sun, as if he exerted some repellant action on the matter forming the heads of comets. Indeed Sir John Herchel did not hesitate to say that the existence of such a repulsive force was, to all intent and purposes, demonstrated by the phenomena of comet tails. It is certain that the November meteors, the August meteors and other such systems follow in the track of known comets. We know that when in 1862 the earth passed through the region of space along which Biela's comet had recently traveled, there was a display of thousands of meteors, all radiating from just that part of the heavens from which bodies traveled parallel to the orbit of Biela's comet would have seemed to radiate. It follows from this association between comets, and meteors, and from the fact that probably thousands of meteoric and cometic systems travel close to the sun, that in all probability there must exist generally, if not always, in the sun's neighborhood, enormous quantities of the substance whence comet's tails are formed by the sun's repellant action.—*Popular Science Monthly.*
