THE REGISTER'S EXCLUSIVE DISCOVERY.

Though economical and careful the present county court has sacrificed nothing in order to make a showing, but the interests of the county are being taken care of as well as those of any county in the state, both as to roads and bridges.

Linn county runs on 14.30 mills taxation; Lane 23.50 mills. Therein lies the secret of the Register discovery that Linn county roads and bridges have been neglected. It could not work the courthouse excuse, for Linn county has just rebuilt her courthouse at an expense of about half what Lage county expended on her new building. The truth of the old adage is again verified. The people of Linn county must go away from hometo the Register office, Eugene-to find out how sadly their roads and bridges have been neglected.

And all for the reason that the taxpayer of Linn county pays \$14.50 on the thousand, while in Lane he has the pleasant opportunity of yielding \$23,50 to the taxgatherer. Some of our citizens, like Dr. Kuykendall who wants no comparisons made, nor mention of our tax levy for fear of injuring the county, should improve the opportunity and help put Kincaid and Hill into the commissioners court to rectify matters.
