SPENDTHRIFT BONI CASTELLANE.

PARIS, Nov. 1.—The debts of the Countess Castellane, formerly Miss Anna Gould, aggregate 25,000,000 francs. The appointment of her brother, George Gould, as trustee to prevent the further squandering of her fortune by her husband, Count Boni de Castellane, will be resisted by the countess. She declares that herself and husband will not accept George Gould as trustee.

BOERS STILL ACTIVE.

CAPE TOWN, Nov. 1.—A detachment of Boers have captured a British outpost of 90 men. They looted and destroyed a mail train.

DISAGREEMENT OF POWERS.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1.—France and the United States have not yet agreed to accept the terms of settlement of the Chinese question proposed by Great Britain and Germany. The former powers reject the third clause. [The third clause is virtually an agreement between Great Britain and Germany to protect their own interests against aggression of any other power.—ED. THESE ARE FOR BRYAN. Ministers of the Gospel Tell Why They Support Him.

An address signed by a number of clergymen has been issued and signed as follows:

We, the undersigned ministers of religion, declare our deep conviction that the war against the Philippines is not right. We regard it as a war of quest and directly within Mr McKinley's definition of "criminal aggression."

We refuse to accept the undemocratic conclusion that, because the American people can by might govern colonies, they ought to do so. We deny that even the president or congress may rightfully govern any man anywhere outside the protecting restraints of the constitution. We agree with Benjamin Franklin "that neither the obtaining, nor the retaining of any trade, is an object for which men may justly shed each other's blood." We feel bound to withhold our approval of the immoral use of the public authority even to accomplish an assumed moral end.

We hold that what is immoral for men to do acting singly is immoral for them to do acting collectively as a nation. Each step in a course of action must be moral if the end is not to be attained with immorality. No end can justify immoral means to secure it. It is too late to maintain the doctrine that in the sacred name of religion we may kill some men in order to convert those who survive. "Love, not force, was the weapon of the Nazarene; sacrifice for others, not exploitation of them was His method of reaching the human heart."

We desire to see America exercise her influence as a "world power" in a new, rather than in the old way. We view with grave apprehension the tendency to make her what other nations are. We desire to see her become the supreme moral factor in the world's progress. Any great and permanent increase of her military establishment, with the civilization of the military spirit among us, will indicate moral deterioration.

OREGON'S HOP CROP.

The Balance Unsold in Growers' Hands About 10,000 Bales.

Salem Journal.

How many hops are left in dealers' hands in Oregon?

This is a leading question with all buyers.

Hops that are left are held by speculative growers who prefer taking chances on a fancy price to selling at a fair rate.

The balance unsold is estimated at from 8,000, 10,000 to 12,000 bales.

The Oregon market is not so active. Many of the smaller buyers have filled all their orders. While the London market remains firm orders are not so plenty.

Still there is a margin for a firm market and a chance for a corner in Oregon hops by speculative buyers.

Lillenthal Bros claim they have bought 5,000 bales of the 80,000 bales produced in Oregon this year.

A number of the leading dealers were interviewed today. They agree that there is a perceptible lull in this market, and hops are not being rushed in by the growers as they were a week ago, whether because they are nearly all out of growers' hands or from some other cause.

Squire Farrar estimates that there are from 12,000 to 15,000 bales still in growers' hands in Oregon.

J Carmichael says from best information obtainable from the hop centers, there are from 12,000 to 15,000 bales unsold, and Washington advises identical about the same amount in that state.

Ed C Herren says not over 13,000 bales, and that none remain in growers' hands south of Eugene, where there still a few thousand bales left.

In the matter of price 15¢ cents seems to have been the top figure named for a choice article.
