SUIT FOR DIVORCE.

A dispatch says: Mrs. Mary E. Lease will this week file suit in the district court of Wichita, Kansas, asking that divorce be granted her from her husband, Charles Lease. She will charge incompatibility and failure to provide. Mr. Lease says he will contest the suit.

Colton at the University.

Last night at 6:45 Mr E T Colton, International Student Secretary for the Y M C A spoke to more than fifty students and professors in Laurean Hall. Mr Colton is a typical college man, holder of several oratorical medals, a man whose intimate acquaintance with student life makes him well calculated to speak to college men on living themes.

He spoke for about forty minutes from the words "Whatever a man soweth, that shall he also reap." The certainty of the crop, its influence on our lives, and on other lives were used as motives urging the men to sow for a crop of good results.

This morning Mr Colton addressed a special assembly. His theme was "Some Characteristics of American Student Life." The first is the rapid growth in the number who are attending the colleges all over the United States. The second is the physical supremacy of American students. This was shown at the Paris Exposition where out of 24 scratch events, 18 first places and many more second places were won by Americans against the world. The secret of this supremacy is in the fact that American students compel the body to be under the control of the will. The third characteristic is devotion to sentiment and principle. At the Paris Exposition American colleges protested against athletic contests on Sunday. Out of ten American universities represented, but two entered the Sunday contest. While the American student may not be the equal of the German in scholarship it is because he is not willing to pay the price of weakened physique and ruined morals.

One great factor in the development of the American student is the Young Men's Christian Associations now found in 600 colleges and universities of the United States. In these Y M C A's are found more men than in the fraternities, oratorical, literary and athletic organizations. In Yale Y M C A are over 1000 men. Many of the best scholars and athletes of America are leaders in Christian work. College presidents were quoted as being highly in favor of this work.

The notion has long since been dropped that men's learning cannot be believers in the Bible. In conclusion, Mr Colton urged the students to get a right perspective of life and to build characters which would stand in the testing time. Tonight, Mr Colton addresses a men's meeting at Villard Hall on "Students Temptation. The Battle Ground of College Life." Every indication points to a large attendance.
