Intense Heat in Europe.

LONDON, June 3.—For several days intense heat has prevailed over the continent, accompanied by heavy storms of thunder and hail.

In various sections the crops have been destroyed, and many deaths have been caused by lightning. The Ursuline convent, at Bosphord, on the Rhine, was demolished and three women were killed. Four people were killed by lightning at Puciaro, near Udine, Italy, last Friday.

A Baker City Mine.

Baker City, June 4.—The monthly clean-up for the Bohemia mine, of this district, was brought to the city today.

No figures are given out by the management as to the amount of the clean-up, but it is authoritatively known that it is very close to the clean-up for April, which aggregated about \$60,000 from the plates, not counting the concentrates, which are not of high value.

For the past four months this property has been averaging about \$60,000 to \$65,000 from the plates, the ore treated being taken from the 300 foot level.

Whitney the Terminus.

Baker City, June 4.—An excursion was run from this place to Whitney Sunday, marking the establishment of rail connections to that point now the terminus of the Sumpter Valley railway.

For the past two years Sumpter has enjoyed the distinction of being the terminus of this road, and since Whitney has got the line, there will be much competition for the mining business from certain interior points.

DIED.

Heart Failure Calls Another of Our Prominent Citizens Away.

Norman P. Hammett, who has resided in Lane county since 1850, died from heart failure Sunday night, June 2, 1901, at his home in Mohawk valley, aged 73 years.

His beloved wife and three of his children were in Eugene visiting at the time the final summons came, as Mr. Hammett had been enjoying excellent health. At about 10 o'clock last night some of the children at home heard their father make some noise in his room and asked what was the matter, when he replied, "Get me a light," and expired.

Mr. Hammett leaves a wife and 13 children. The following are the names of the children: Mrs. Belle Seavey, Miss Mae Hammett, Mrs. Fannie Barger, Miss Maud Hammett, Miss Grace Hammett, of Lane county, and Ben and Marion Hammett, of Delta, Idaho, George Hammett, of Robinson, B. C., and Paul, Dish, John, Claud and Clarence Hammett, of Lane county; also three sisters, Mrs. D. Foster of Oakland, Cal., and Miss Melissa Hammett and Elizabeth Zimmerman of Ottumwa, Iowa, and one brother, Ben Hammett, of Ottumwa, Iowa.

Mr. Hammett was quite prominent in political circles, but never held office; he was honest and conscientious and beloved by his fellow neighbors. He built the old courthouse in 1855. The funeral and interment will be held in Stafford cemetery Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock.
