

RUSSIAN TRADE BY PROXY.

The United States has an underground railroad into Russia, commercially speaking. It is estimated that Germany and England last year sent over \$20,000,000 worth of American manufactured agricultural and railroad machinery to Russia, as of their own manufacture, while our direct exports amounted to but \$11,000,000.

It is a common practice to remove the American name plate and substitute that of a German firm. Germany has a great advantage over almost every other manufacturing nation in that the Teutons have established branch banks in almost every large city of Russia, while their agents act as distributors, becoming in time the actual managers of newly established Russian works and naturally favoring home products and machinery. Moreover, Germany sells on long-time credit, while America, without banking facilities abroad, must demand cash payments; consequently the Germans find it profitable to purchase American machinery for cash, change the name plate so that they may secure any duplicate orders, and sell at an advance, on credit, the only terms on which the average business man in Russia can or will buy.

EUROPEAN TRADE.

There is little in the scare cry that Europe will combine against the United States on trade relations. They cannot agree among themselves on political questions and are not likely to harmoniously come together when a division of trade is attempted. In fact, though, the trade of Great Britain is our big item, and she must have our wheat, cotton, hops, livestock and other agricultural products, besides she has made her wealth through free-trade and is not likely to reverse her policy at this late day.

The continental countries of Europe have been on a high tariff scale for many years, and are too poor to buy to any great extent. Most of the agitation against this country comes from Germany, Emperor William never losing an opportunity to prejudice us with his people.

MIXED ON SUPREME COURT DECISION.

The first series of uniform university entrance examinations has come to an end. The examinations were carried on at sixty-one different points in the United States, at London and Dresden, Saxony. Of the 472 candidates applying to the board 153 were prepared in public high schools, 142 in academies and endowed schools, and 150 in private schools and classes. The successful candidates have the choice among the leading universities of the East and Middle States, most of them being in the arrangement. Columbia University, New York City, gets the lion's share, one hundred and fifty declaring their intention of entering that university. The reason assigned for the large proportion of students that will fall to Columbia's share is that no special examinations are required by that university, the common board examination being accepted as conclusive as to the qualification of the applicant.

The bondsmen of ex-School Clerk Davis will resist payment of the five thousand dollar bond which they signed for the good behavior of the school board appointee. They should not be compelled to pay it. Davis was appointed by state officials elected by the people, and the state should stand loathe instead of trying to saddle it on a few innocent bondsmen.
