

CARNEGIE NAMES IT.

Modern Warfare Nothing Short of Brutal Murder.

New York, Jan 28.—"The killing of men under the name of war," wrote Andrew Carnegie in a letter which was read at the P F Collier dinner at the Metropolitan Club last night, "is the foulest blot upon humanity today. We see much discussion as to what is, or what is not promised under civilized warfare. My view is that this is a contradiction of terms. There can be no such thing as civilized warfare. We have made little progress in the path of genuine civilization as long as we can find no better substitute for the settling of international disputes than the brutal murder of one another. As a general proposition, it may be stated that the nation which refuses peaceful arbitration is responsible for the war which ensues. Britain, having done this in its dispute with the Transvaal Republic, is responsible for the extermination of a brave and heroic Christian people.

"But let us also remember that we are today engaged in shooting down Christian Filipinos, whose only crime is that they believe in the Declaration of Independence. Sad that both branches of the so-called most highly civilized race should be guilty of the most uncivilized crimes. Let us all pray that this disgrace is soon to pass away."

"WAR IS HELL."

Seattle, Jan 29.—Clarence Clowe, of Seattle, recently arrived home from the Philippines, where he served as a private in Company H, Twenty-fifth Infantry, U. S. V., has authorized the publication of a letter written by him to Senator Hoar from the islands June 10, 1900. Clowe asks in the letter for honorable discharge from a service that is outraging his conscience. In alleging inhuman treatment by American soldiers toward Filipinos he says, in part:

"At any time I am liable to be called upon to go out and bind and gag helpless prisoners, to strike them in the face, to knock them down when so bound, to bear them away from wife and children, at their very door, who are shrieking pitifully the while, or kneeling and kissing the hands of our officers, imploring mercy from those who seem not to know what it is; and then, with a crowd of soldiers, hold our helpless victim head downward in a tub of water in his own yard; or bind him hand and feet, attaching ropes to head and feet, and then lowering him into the depths of a well of water, till life is well-nigh choked out, and the bitterness of death has been tasted, and our poor, gasping victims ask us for the poor boon of being finished off in mercy to themselves.

"All these things have been done at one time or another by our men, generally in cases of trying to obtain information as to the location of arms and ammunition.

"Nor can it be said that there is any general repulsion on the part of the enlisted men to taking part in these things. I regret to have to say that on the contrary the majority of soldiers take a keen delight in them and rush with joy to the making of this latest development of a Roman holiday."

SKYSCRAPER FOR LONDON.

What would be thought of a business building to cost nearly ten million dollars, exclusive of grounds? Yet such a skyscraper is in contemplation for London. A recent dispatch gives these particulars:

The London county council today considered the application in behalf of an Anglo-American syndicate headed by Sir Charles Rivers Wilson for a nine hundred and ninety-nine year lease on the property on the north side of the Strand, with a frontage of 750 feet, and with still larger frontage on the new streets debouching on the Strand, for the erection of an office building on American lines to cost two million pounds. The council took the ground that such length of tenure practically amounted to selling the freehold, which was not within its power.

The council, however, announced that it was willing to negotiate on the basis of a ninety-nine year lease.

Mrs. S. J. Bonnett died at the family residence in Eugene, from jaundice, at 10 o'clock last night. The funeral will be held at the Christian church tomorrow forenoon at 11 o'clock, Rev E C Henderson, dean of the Divinity School, conducting the services. Interment in I O O F cemetery.

Annis (Parsons) Bonnett was born October 1st, 1822, in Randolph county, Virginia, now West Virginia. Moved with her parents to Iowa in 1834. Was married to Samuel J Bonnet Nov 26, 1840. Emigrated to Oregon in 1854, arriving at Eugene September 18th of that year. At that time Alford, the oldest son was a lad of 13 years while the youngest, Perry, was but 15 months old. This pioneer woman drove a team the greater part of the way across the plains. Among the party were the Veatch's, of Cottage Grove, the Reinehart's and the late Thomas Edwards.

The Bonnetts were the sixth family to reside in Eugene. Later they moved to a claim on the McKenzie river near the Spore bridge, residing there till 1863 when they moved to Eugene. She united with the Christian church in 1842. Her husband survives her together with nine children: Alford, Marion, Perry and Albert, and Mrs S in Thomas, all residing in Eugene; Charles and Marcelus, of Burns, Harney county, and Mrs R P Dey and Mrs Norris J Brown, of Oakland, California.
