WIRELESS TELEGRAPH **TABOOED**

Russian Promises to Users of it.

Will Be Treated as Spies When Caught Using Wireless in Zone of Military Operations.

Washington, April 15 .- The state department has received a note from MISSOURI the Russian ambassador to the effect that newspaper men in the zone of military operations in the Far East caught using vireless telegraphy apparatus bereafter will be treated as spies by the Russian government. The ambassador's note constitutes the principal topic of the cabinet meeting today. A number of correspondents of English and American papers use the wireless.
