Vladivostok Across the Big Pacific the Unfortunate

Fire Started by Malcontents and Reservists -- Looting Attended the Fire--Famine Inreatens the People

St. Petersburg, Nov. 15 .- A telegram just received from Viadivostok says the whole town and port was burning, the greater part of the place having already teen consumed.

Vladivostok, Nov. 15. - The situation is desperate, the mobs practically controlling the city and looting is unabated. The flames are spreading and famine threatens the people. During the first day's rioting three handred rioters, mostly saliors and GOOD. artillerymen, were killed or wounded. The fire was started by malcontent. and reservists.
