## CONSIDERING DEMANDS OF MINERS

Railroad Presidents Baer and Wilcox Given Full Power to Act

Likely to Grant Demand for Increase of Wages and Will Meet This by Raising the Price of Coal to Consumers

New York, March 7.—The sub-committee of the anthracite operators is considering the demands of the miners and will not likely end the work before the end of the week. It is understood the sub-committee is composed of railroad presidents Baer and Wilcox, who have full power. Their action is problematic, but it is practically certain that the operators will flatly reject the demand for a full recognition of the union and demand the institution of the "check off" system in the anthracite region. It is likely they will grant the demand for an increase in wages and meet the increase with a higher price for coal to the consumer.

## AGREEMENT WILL PROBABLY BE REACHED

Berlin, March 7.—The foreign office states that conciliatory instructions have been sent to the German representatives at Algiers, and it is expected that an agreement will be reached.

## NO NEW DEVELOPMENTS AT CALDWELL

Only Attorneys for Prosecution and Defense Left Boise Today

No Reason Is Given for Not Taking Prisoners Into Court to Plead--County Officers Being Investigated

Boise, Idaho, March 7.—Attorneys Hawley, for the prosecution, and Miller, for the defense, were the only passengers for Caldwell this morning. No new developments in the Steunenberg murder case.

It is believed that all indictments have been returned. No reason is given for not taking the prisoners into court to plead, unless the prosecution plans are to not serve warrants until after the hearing of the habeas proceedings, in the supreme court Friday. The grand jury is investigating the condition and accounts of the Canyon county officers.

## MUNICIPAL OWNERSHIP MAYOR

Seattle, March 7.—In the closest election ever held in Seattle Moore, the municipal ownership candidate for mayor won by 15 votes. A recount of the vote is threatened. Out of thirteen councilmen 12 Republicans are probably elected.

## BIDS HIGH FOR VALUABLE FRANCHISE

Portland, March 7.—The Willamette Valley Traction Company and The United Railways Company are both bidding for the franchise on Front street in this city.

The former offers to build a standard gauge line from Jefferson street to the Union depot and give it to the city, also to give \$50,000 to the city for the 25 year franchise—construction costs \$60,000.

To lease the line and pay \$1 for each car hauled over it, providing other companies pay \$2.50 a car for same privileges. The total return to the city in 25 years would be nearly \$600,000.

The United people want to build the line and pay \$150,000 to the city during 25 years, allowing other companies equal rights and all companies to pay pro rata for keeping the line in repair.

## KIDNAPPED BANKER'S SON ESCAPES

New York, March 7.—Antonio Bozzuffi, fourteen years of age, a son of an Italian banker, who was kidnapped last Sunday and held for a ransom of \$20,000 returned home this morning. Detectives are investigating the circumstances. The boy said he was given nothing to eat during his imprisonment and said he escaped when his captors left the room.

## NONE OF GOVERNMENT'S BUSINESS, SAYS ARMOUR

Chicago, March 7.—T. M. Robertson, special examiner of the bureau of corporations, testified in the packers' case this morning. J. Ogden Armour refused to disclose the affairs of Armour & Company because he did not believe "it was any of the government's business, that it was incorporated for their own convenience, and was merely private family business."

## OPPOSED TO RATE REGULATION

Senator Scott Thinks Commission Will Have Too Much Power

Takes Position That Rate Regulation Is in Form of Government Ownership--Recognizes Demand

Washington, March 7.—Senator Scott, of West Virginia, in the senate this afternoon spoke declaring that he is opposed to giving the Interstate Commerce Commission power to fix the contested rate without a provision in the act for a broad general court review. He took the position that the rate regulation is in the form of government ownership. He said he recognized the demand for rate legislation, but would have it restricted.

## PRINCESS JOINS CATHOLIC CHURCH

Madrid, March 7.—Princess Ena was baptized today under the name of Victoria into the Catholic faith. Alfonso's mother acted as godmother. Premier Moret represented the government.

## FRESNO HAS A DISASTROUS FIRE

Fresno, Cal., March 7.—Thirty-five young draught horses were burned to death in a fire which destroyed the stable of the Fresno City Hay Market at four o'clock this morning. Two employes barely escaped with their lives by jumping. Over three hundred tons of hay was also destroyed. Loss \$15,000.

## PRESIDENT SENDS MESSAGE TO CONGRESS

Signs Tillman-Gillespie Railroad and Coal Oil Regulation

Hesitates to Sign Because as Pessed It Achieves Little or Nothing--Asks For Money to Carry on Work

Washington, March 7.—President Roosevelt today sent a message to congress saying he had signed the Tillman-Gillespie resolution demanding an inquiry into railroad discriminations and monopolies of coal oil. He said he hesitated to sign it because as passed it achieved little or nothing. He asks that additional legislation be made providing for money to carry on the investigation and provide for compulsion of witnesses to attend and answer questions, and to state definitely what the commission is to do and how far it shall go. He also urges possible incompatibility of such an investigation and criminal proceedings.

## GENERAL SCHOFIELD BURIED WITH HONORS

Washington, March 7.—Schofield was buried this afternoon with full military honors. The president and other high governmental officials participated in the services.

## OPERATORS WILL NOT MAKE CONCESSION

Chicago, March 7.—Illinois coal operators at a meeting in this city today to consider the miners' demands unanimously agreed that no further concessions will be made.
