ERUPTION

GROWS WORSE

Volcanic Explosions Increase in Numbers and Intensity

Cities About Being Buried With Ashes--Veritable Panic at Naples--Scientists Think the Worst is to Come

Naples, April 11.—Many thousand lives have already been lost as the result of this eruption of Vesuvius, while the property loss is estimated at \$80,000,000.

The eruption this morning is increasing in violence. The inhabitants have completely abandoned Ottajano and the manufacturing town of Sarano, of ten thousand inhabitants, has been overwhelmed with ejecta. Lava has wrecked the hamlet of Sangennetro. At Somma the chimneys are six feet deep in the streets, while at San-

guseppe the debris has reached the third story windows. The lava has reached Pompeii and Poggio Marino is buried under ashes.

All hope for people remaining near Vesuvius has been abandoned. Refugees tell of scores buried alive, doomed to death by suffocation. Entire families were found dead kneeling at shrines, slain by the deadly gases. The terrible beauty and magnificence of the eruption at night are beyond the powers of the human tongue to describe.

Engineers have refused to take out railroad trains from Naples because of darkness and traffic is suspended.

WORST YET TO COME.

Explosions are increasing in number and intensity. Many new craters are forming. There is most severe subterranean agitation. Scientists think the worst is yet to come. Lava is again on the move down all sides of the mountain.

Naples is in the greatest danger. The people are positively mad. Business is at a standstill. The poorer classes are fighting madly for places in the churches to prostrate themselves at altars.

All shipping is leaving the harbor. The number of vessels is wholly inadequate. Fifty houses and three churches in Somma have collapsed. Houses are falling in all cities. A terrific hurricane struck Torre Del Greco and refugees covered with dust assert that the storm was accom-

panied by showers of stones as large as eggs.

Naples, April 11.—There is gloom everywhere in the city. Refugees are jangling the streets, bearing lighted candles and crosses and chanting prayers.

Scientist Mattucci, from his observatory near the volcano, endeavored to calm the city this evening with the following: "The situation is very grave. The observatory is enveloped in dense showers of sand. The volcano is calmer now and the seismic instruments show quieter records. I am confident Vesuvius will soon return to a normal condition."

Arcola is threatened. The village of Terzigno is completely annihilated and probably 125 are dead. It is thought 175 are dead at Ottajano. Thirty children panic-stricken while being conveyed by soldiers from Torre Del Greco, fled into the woods and perished under the ashes. Fifty shiploads of refugees reached the city this morning. Seven Italian warships are assisting in the work of rescue. All places of public resort are closed. A mutiny of prisoners in the city prison was quelled. Trouble has occurred in many villages on account of the difficulty to obtain food. Prices have soared to enormous heights. The military found Agovahova in a state of riot, the starving villagers having turned the place into a perfect inferno.
