INGHAM VINEGAR FACTORY WILL REMAIN HERE

The Guard is glad to announce today that the Ingham vinegar factory, one of the most important manufacturing industries in Eugene, will not be removed to Portland, as previously announced, but will continue in operation here. E. H. Ingham, one of the principal owners of the plant, yesterday stated positively that the plant will remain, but that he will remove to Portland, where he will engage in similar business. He was not ready to state who would operate the factory here, but it will be in competent hands.

It will be remembered that Mr. Ingham announced a few months ago that the plant would be taken to Portland because of excessive railroad rates on its product from Eugene. The Eugene commercial bodies took the matter up with the Southern Pacific Company, with the result that a satisfactory rate was arranged, but still Mr. Ingham talked of removing the plant to Portland. He has at last, however, decided that it will be best to leave it here and operate another one in the metropolis.

PROCLAMATION.

Whereas, There was submitted to the electors of the state at the last general election as required by law an initiative petition for a proposed amendment to Section 2 of Article XI of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, giving cities and towns exclusive power to enact and amend their charters, subject to the constitution and criminal laws of the State of Oregon, and

Whereas, on the 25th day of June 1906 the Secretary of State in my presence as Governor of the State of Oregon did canvass the votes given for and against said amendment and

Whereas, it was ascertained and determined upon such canvass that there were 52,567 votes cast for said amendment and 19,852 votes against the same, and that said amendment received an affirmative majority of the total number of effective votes cast thereon and entitled to be counted under the provisions of law

Now, therefore, I, Geo. A. Chamberlain, as Governor of the State of Oregon, in obedience to and by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by law, do hereby make and issue this proclamation to the people of the State of Oregon, and do announce and declare that the whole number of votes cast in the State of Oregon at said election for and against said proposed amendment was as hereinbefore stated, and that said proposed amendment received an affirmative majority of the total number of votes cast thereon and entitled to be counted under the provisions of law, and that said amendment heretofore mentioned shall be and is in full force and effect as a part of the constitution of the State of Oregon from the date of this proclamation.

Done at the capitol this 25th day of June, A. D. 1906.

LUCKY BOY MINE SHORT OF HANDS

Louis Zimmerman, president of the Lucky Boy Mining Co., arrived in Eugene from the mine at 12 o'clock last night on his way back to Portland. He brought out a lot of bulidion, the result of the last cleaning up at the 40-stamp mill, and took it to Portland on this afternoon's train. The amount of the cleaning this time is not given, but it is presumed that it is up to the average as the miners are now working in good ore.

Mr. Zimmerman told a Guard reporter this morning that operations at the mine are greatly hampered at present by the scarcity of laborers. It is a hard matter to get enough men to operate the plant to its full capacity and now the force is considerably smaller than it ought to be. Mr. Zimmerman says that at least 50 men are necessary to operate the plant on full time and they ought to have 60. The wages paid by the company are good but it seems that the men, most of whom come from the cities, become dissatisfied with mountain life and are constantly leaving.

EUGENE MAN GETS O. R. & N. CONTRACT

Samuel Manerud, of this city, is preparing to ship several teams of horses, half a dozen wheeled dirt scrapers, shovels, picks and other tools, besides a lot of hay and other horse feed, to Bridal Veil, where he has a contract with the O. R. & N. Co. in the straightening of the company's railway tracks in that vicinity.

Mr. Manerud will be employed there for a several months and will take a number of Eugene men with him to assist him in the work.
