

BRYAN'S ADVICE TO NEW STATE SOUND AND RIGHT

Guthrie, Okla., Dec. 15.—A communication from William J. Bryan, in which he made a number of suggestions, was read today before the constitutional convention. One suggestion was the creation of a board of corporations. He also urged the convention to adopt the initiative and referendum, and to provide for the nomination of all officers by the primary system.

The committee on federal relations reported favorably on the proposal for two amendments to the United States constitution, one for the election of senators by direct vote of the people, and one for an income tax.

MINERAL SPRINGS OF LANE COUNTY

Lane county is rich in mountain scenery and mountain attractions, the summit of the "ascade mountains" holding its robes of white hill well along in the summer, with perpetual snow on the Three Sisters and Diamond Peak. Few appreciate the extent of the Cascade mountains, dividing Western and Eastern Oregon. It is a vast region, rich in timber and mineral, but practically unsettled except in scattering homes along the streams that have in the ages cut deep but narrow valleys in their course westward to the wide and fertile Willamette valley. Even few of our own people really appreciate the extent and character of our Cascade and coast mountains. In Lane county the Cascade mountains stretch some seventy miles north and south, and forty to fifty miles west from the summit—a wilderness but for the occasional homes along the rivers. The McKenzie, the finest stream in Oregon, flows westward from its source to the Willamette, entirely in Lane county, while the Willamette, having its source in the extreme southeast corner of the county, flows diagonally northwesterly some seventy miles to Eugene, then takes a northerly course to its confluence with the Columbia, twelve miles below Portland.

Hot Mineral Springs.
On the McKenzie, sixty miles east of Eugene, are located the Belknap Hot Springs, and six miles therefrom, on Horse creek—the principal tributary of the McKenzie—the Foley Hot Springs. They have the same temperature, 187 degrees, and substantially the same analysis. The drinking of this mineral water and the use of its hot baths have efficacies in rheumatism, skin and blood diseases, especially in rheumatism, many permanent cures of that painful nerve-racking disease being held to their credit.

Kison Springs, on a small tributary of the Willamette, fifty-five miles southeast of Eugene, flow tepid water, and, though of different analysis from the McKenzie hot springs, is also a specific for rheumatism and stomach diseases. On both rivers the springs are situated well in the heart of the wild mountain region, with purest, cold waters, and air laden with the fragrance of the fir which thickly covers the country. These springs are not cure-alls. Persons afflicted with pulmonary complaints and dropsy should not take these baths.

Coast Range.
On the west for something like forty miles back from the ocean, are the coast mountains, covered by fir timber except where swept by fire. Small streams flow valleyward and to the ocean at intervals along which is the usual settler. The coast mountains being lower than the Cascades, afford a retreat for deer the year around. The underbrush is very thick, probably on account of the much greater rainfall along the coast, and the hunter, unless he has the instinct to its fullness, is at a disadvantage in the brush.

AN OREGON PIONEER OF SIXTY YEARS

Floyd Vaughan made the trip to Portland and back yesterday, quite a contrast with the first time he went there. That was in 1856, a half century ago. There were no bridges in those days and with no brush and no fencing the pioneer picked his road anywhere, only he had to strike the fords and ferries. It took three weeks to make the trip with ox teams, there being few horses and those useless for hauling heavy loads on the soft ground.

Mr. Vaughan, who bears his seventy-five years lightly, notwithstanding a mixup with his Jersey bull a few years ago, came to the state in 1847, nearly sixty years ago, and to Lane county in 1856.
