NEW PRESIDENT OF CORVALLIS SCHOOL

Corvallis, Or., May 2.—Dr. W. J. Kerr, president of the State Agricultural College, of Utah, is president-elect of the Oregon State Agricultural College. He was unanimously elected at a special meeting of the board of regents this afternoon, at which all members were in attendance except Secretary of State Benson. He is to take charge of the Oregon institution at the annual meeting of the board July 17, when the resignation of President Gatch takes effect. He still retains his position in the Utah college, but will resign there to accept the position here. Dr. Kerr is a scientist of national reputation. He is 43 years of age, graduate of Cornell University, the Agricultural College of the State of New York, and has been 13 years a college president, of which the last seven years were spent in the presidency of the State Agricultural College of Utah.
