

**MANY KILLED
BY EXPLOSION
IN R. R. CAMP**

Charlotte, N. C., May 13.—As a result of a premature explosion in Camp No. 2, on the Southwestern Railroad, near Marion, S. C., Saturday, fourteen men are dead. Eight bodies have been recovered, including that of Foreman Kiddis, whose body was badly mangled.

At the same camp Sunday afternoon Walking Boss Kidd was shot and killed by a man named Anderson in a quarrel. Anderson had been drinking. Charles Hales, who was with Kidd, then shot and killed Anderson.

Hales and five others are under arrest, charged with murder.

NEWS IN BRIEF

Representing Portland and Eastern timber men, George Estes of the Oregon Savings & Trust Company, and Dr. Stryker, of Portland, Saturday purchased the Medford & Crater Lake railroad. The price paid was \$2,000, which was an advance of \$17,000 over the highest bid made at the first sale. The road is to be extended, as originally planned.

Congressman Llewellyn Powers, of Maine, has announced, it is said to the party leaders that he is serving his last term.

Clarence McBroom, a well-known young rancher of Ematilla county, was shot and instantly killed by Gen. H. H. Hensman, a neighboring rancher, at Gardane schoolhouse, about 45 miles south of Pendleton, at 11:30 Sunday morning. The killing followed a fist fight which was the result of a quarrel of several months' standing.

TELEGRAPHIC BREVITIES

Senator Foraker has issued a statement repudiating Boss Cox's peace plans in Ohio and declaring his intention of fighting Taft to a finish.

Ninety men are supposed to have lost their lives in a fire which started in the Tenares copper mines at Valerdena, in the State of Durango, Mexico, last Friday night. The fire is still raging, and it is said to be beyond control.

**THE LATE DR. WATSON
AND HIS WIDOW**

The Rev. Dr. John Watson, known better by his pen name of Ian MacLaren, who died last week quite suddenly in Iowa, came to America to lecture and preach, and was fond of taking his wife with him on his travels. She accompanied him on his last trip and was here once before. This was Dr. Watson's third visit to the United States. The author of "Beside the Bonnie Brier Bush" had a charming home at Liverpool, where he was so long pastor of Sotton Park Presbyterian church. Dr. and Mrs. Watson had several children, and the family in-

cludes a number of animal pets. The author signed his own name to his writings on religious topics, and in the case of his stories used the pen name of Ian MacLaren. The "Ian" of this name is Gaelic for John, and MacLaren was his mother's maiden name. He recently finished a new story, a historical romance entitled "John Graham of Claverhouse." It deals with the adventures of a Scotch cavalier.

**GOVERNOR'S STAND
AWES RIOTERS**

San Francisco, May 13.—The determined stand taken by Governor Gillette to send troops to San Francisco on the first sign of violence evidently had the salutary effect and all the morning cars were running without interruption. The cars were crowded with passengers.

The governor is still here and will remain until the strike situation is less acute.

Ninety-two cars are operating on six lines of the United Railroads, and thousands of passengers are being carried this afternoon. A new ten thousand dollar car was stoned and partially wrecked. On all lines passengers are being upbraided by crowds for riding, but curses and words of obscenity that were such shocking features of last week's disturbances were not heard today.

**SMELTING PLANT
RESUMES OPERATIONS**

Salt Lake, May 13.—The plant of the American Smelting & Refining Company at Murray resumed today under the protection of 75 deputy sheriffs. No disorder occurred.

**TRYING TO SECURE
HAYWOOD JURY**

Boise, May 13.—Court in the Haywood case opened at 2:01 today. Sheriff Hodgins has been summoning a new venire since Thursday, and it is expected that a complete jury will be selected within three days. Eleven men have been held under lock and key since Thursday, but it is said today that of these but two will qualify as members of the jury panel.

Governor's Son in Court.

Julian P. Steunenberg, the 21-year-old son of the former governor, was in the court room this afternoon. All the prisoner's family, including his invalid wife, and two daughters, were also present. Judge Wood announced:

"If any proposed juror has a legal excuse to offer he will now step forward."

Immediately there was an uproar in the court room. It seemed that fully half of the special venire rose as one man and began to press forward to catch the ear of the court.

Twenty-four members of the special venire were excused for legal reasons and the examination of talesmen commenced at 3:25.

**SORROWFUL SHRINERS
DEPART FOR HOME**

Santa Barbara, Cal., May 13.—Two or three hundred grief-stricken Shriners, survivors of the wreck horror at Honda Saturday evening, are preparing to leave tonight on a long funeral train, on which the bodies of thirty-two victims will be taken home. All flags in the city are half-masted.

DRUG TRUST HIT HARD

(Daily Guard, Monday, May 9.)
BY COURT DECREE
INDIANAPOLIS, May 9.—The so-called "drug trust" was perpetually enjoined today from continuing its operations, the injunction being in the form of a decree of the United States district court of Indiana upon complaint of the United States government.

The defendants, 92 in number, are restrained from combining to restrain the sale of drugs, fix prices by agreement, blacklist dealers who cut prices or refuse to sell to any retailer on equal terms. All publications of blacklists are forbidden and all contracts and agreements covered by the charges are declared void.
