

DRINKS WOOD ALCOHOL AND DIES IN FEW HOURS

Guard Special Service.

Cottage Grove, May 13.—Henry Reeve, a Russian Finn, aged about 40 years, drank a quantity of wood alcohol here Saturday night and died from the effects of the poison Sunday forenoon about 9 o'clock. The man purchased the alcohol at Benson's drug store, and the bottle was duly labeled "poison." It is not known whether the man drank it with suicidal intent or thinking it was ordinary alcohol and wanted to get "full."

Reeve was a stranger here and nothing is known of him. Papers on his person revealed his name, also the fact that he had served in the Russian army. He had 16 cents in his pockets. It is not known whether or not he could read English, but it is thought by some that he could not and that he did not know the stuff was poison.

Others think that the man, being ill and out of work, drank the poison to end all of his troubles.

SOME GROWERS ABANDON THEIR HOP YARDS

(From Friday's Guard.)

The present rain is a blessing in more ways than one. Not only will it help the grain crops, but it will be a material assistance in increasing the output of hops. Owing to the continued dry spell of weather a number of growers, so it is reported to the Guard by one who keeps posted on matters pertaining to the hop industry, have stopped cultivating and will abandon their yards for this year. The ground had become so hard and dry that it was impossible to properly plow it, great clods like boulders being turned up by the plow. This is especially true on higher ground. On the lower levels and in the river bottoms the ground, while very dry, worked better.

One grower informs the Guard that unless this rain continues and an inch or more falls there will be no work to do on any further with the work of cultivating unless the ground is low, as the crop will not be large enough to pay for its harvesting. If the rain is sufficient to properly moisten the ground, however, about half a crop is expected.

LAST WILL OF MRS. SARAH E. BRIDGES

The last will and testament of Mrs. Sarah E. Bridges, who died at Pleasant Hill a few days ago, was filed for probate this morning. It provides that the real and personal property of the estate shall be sold at public or private sale, and after all debts and funeral expenses are paid the proceeds are to be distributed as follows: Fifty dollars to her son, William Dalton Bridges; \$5 to her granddaughter, Ethel Vincent, and the remainder of the money to her daughter, Mrs. Pearl Nixon, and her three minor children, Claud, Edna and Ralph, share and share alike, provided that the portion given to the three minor children shall be used for their support and education until they reach their majority. Darwin Bristow is named as executor in the will. The instrument was drawn up and signed on April 15, 1907.

Mrs. Helene Ohlsen, wife of D. P. Ohlsen, died at her home five miles west of Eugene Sunday evening, May 12, 1907, at 5 o'clock, after only a day's illness. She had been suffering for some time past with paralysis, but had been quite well until she was taken ill a day or two before she died. She was aged 47 years and leaves a husband and eight children, four boys and four girls. The funeral will be held Tuesday at 10 a. m. at the Danish church west of the city, with interment in the Danish cemetery.

Mrs. Susan Haynes, wife of Albert Haynes, died at her home at Hale Saturday evening, May 11, 1907, at the age of 35 years of age. Childbirth was the cause of death. She leaves, besides her husband, eight children, six boys and two girls. The funeral was held this afternoon.

ARRANGE FOR MILITIA
ENCAMPMENT ON COAST

Adjutant-General W. E. Finzer, of the Oregon National Guard, accompanied by Colonel James Jackson, inspector-general, left this morning for Fort Stevens to arrange for the summer maneuvers of seven companies of the state forces, which will be instructed in second week of this year, instead of going into general camp with militia of neighboring states and the federal troops.

The O. N. G. officers will confer with the regular army officers at Fort Stevens with reference to the grounds available for camp purposes, and to arrange various details. It is possible the state will send the eight companies not thus provided for to camp in the vicinity of the maneuvers so they may be ready for instruction in the art of handling the big guns. An order was issued yesterday for the mustering in of a new infantry company Monday night at Oregon City, where a roll has been prepared containing 65 names. Another command at Cottage Grove will be sworn in soon.—Portland Telegram.
