

WOMAN LAUGHED BUT RUNYAN IS BROKEN IN SPIRIT

New York, July 6.—Chester Runyan, talking teller of the Windsor Trust company, who is alleged to have stolen \$95,317 from the company, and Mrs. Laura Carter, the woman who betrayed his hiding place to the police after he had given her part of the stolen funds were arraigned in police court today. Runyan's spirit appeared broken, but the woman was smiling as she went through the ordeal.

\$42,000 of the company's stolen funds are still unaccounted for. Runyan had in his possession when arrested \$14,410. Of the balance he said he had lost about \$16,000 in speculation in stock; that he had given \$15,000 to the Carter woman, and

he believed she had taken \$10,000 more without his knowledge.

Mrs. Carter admits she received \$15,000 which she deposited in a bank and intends to keep it there if she can. She alleges she betrayed Runyan because she felt sorry for Mrs. Runyan.

Runyan was arraigned for grand larceny and the woman was charged with receiving stolen property. Both waived examination and were held for the grand jury. Runyan was held in \$15,000 bail and the Carter woman in \$10,000, which neither was able to furnish.

The Carter woman tells many conflicting stories regarding her connection with the affair.

RECORD-BREAKING CROWD AT THE CELEBRATION

(From Friday's Guard.)

The Fourth has come and gone and with it one of the best celebrations Eugene ever saw. The crowd was a record-breaker, estimates placing the number of visitors at something like 15,000 persons, and with the 7,000 ties of the occasion, the streets were all out and took part in the festivities on the occasion, the streets were a mass of humanity from early morning till late at night.

The weather man relented and contrary to his previous announcement gave us the best of weather possible. It was not too warm and there was not a sign of rain. Everybody was comfortable and there was no complaint whatever. The exercises were held according to the program and everything was a success. The committee worked hard and unceasingly from the beginning of the exercises until the last event was pulled off, and great credit is due the members for their efforts. The parade was something of a disappointment to most of the people, but they should not have expected anything great, as it was not the intention of the committee to secure any elaborate features, preferring to put the money on the other attractions. One feature of the parade had to be omitted at the last minute. The float carrying the little girls representing the several states of the Union broke down just as the parade was about to start and there was not time enough to fix it up again so it was left out. None of the girls were hurt badly, although some of them received slight scratches and bruises.

Swarms From Country.

People from the country began coming into Eugene Wednesday and that night all the hotels and lodging houses were full. The bulk of the crowd drove in during the forenoon yesterday and by the time the exercises began it was plainly evident that no larger crowd ever attended a celebration in Eugene than was here yesterday. The crowd was very orderly and there were no arrests by the officers during the entire day. Everybody seemed happy, had plenty to eat and drink (no booze) and it was a common remark that everybody seemed better dressed this time than ever before, an indication of the prosperous times that prevail throughout Lane county.

Parade Late.

The parade was advertised to start at 9:30 a. m., but owing to accident to the little girls' float it was over half an hour late in leaving the court house corner where it was formed. First came Grand Marshal Amos Wilkins and his aides, F. T. Plank, Henry Mathews and Hugh Hampton, mounted on prancing steeds, followed by the Eugene military band. Then Companies A and C, O. N. G., came, and they were followed by the Goddess of Liberty float. Miss Pearl Gilbert made an excellent Goddess. Her type of beauty is exceedingly suited to the role. As the float passed up and down the streets she was greeted by rounds of applause, showing the admiration of the crowds. Her aides were the Misses Nan Peterson, Edna Yarnell, Pearl Gilbert (cousin of the Goddess) and Florence Striker.

After the Goddess of Liberty float came the Brownsville band and a car containing the chaplain, orator, and the president of the day. After traversing several of the principal streets the parade pulled up at the east park where the literary exercises were held. Judge L. T. Harris, president of the day, opened the exercises by announcing that Rev. O. C. Wright would offer prayer. After music by the band the Declaration of Independence was read by John C. Veatch and the oration delivered by Attorney C. N. McArthur, of Portland. Those who heard the oration speak highly of the effort. Mr. McArthur was a prominent orator during his college days here and he has very much improved since. The little girls who represented the states and whose float broke down, were on the platform, and directed by L. G. Hullin, they sang patriotic songs. After the regular exercises the platform was cleared and Misses Clinton and Cook entertained the audience with their fancy rifle shooting. It was the best ever seen here.

Fire Drill Was Good.

Everybody then went home or to the hotels and restaurants for dinner and shortly after one o'clock the exhibition fire drill took place. The shack that had been built on the empty lot across from the Hotel Groves was fired and the big black team started out of the engine house with the chemical engine and hose
