FREIGHT AGENTS OF MANY OTHER ROADS ARE HERE

THREATS OF EUGENE MERCHANTS TO BOYCOTT SOUTHERN PACIFIC CAUSES ACTIVITY AMONG OTHER COMPANIES

Representatives of Three Different Transcontinental Roads Have Been Here During Week Soliciting Business—As Yet None of the Merchants Have Switched.

The recent action of the Eugene Merchants' Protective Association in threatening to boycott the Southern Pacific Company if its promises regarding a new depot and a train to Wendling are not fulfilled at once is having its effect in more ways than one. As noted in the Guard's telegraphic dispatches yesterday the new train has been ordered and it is reported that the new depot will be built this fall, and the work will commence within a few weeks.

Another effect is the bringing to Eugene of the freight agents of several other roads who are after the business of Eugene merchants for the long haul from the East. Since the meeting of the association last Monday night traveling freight agents of the Great Northern, the Northern Pacific and the Denver & Rio Grande, who have seldom, if ever before, tried to get any business from Eugene people, have been here and interviewed the merchants, offering inducements to route their shipments over their respective lines from the East.

As yet none of the merchants have given any of the other roads their business, waiting to see if the Southern Pacific Company intends to at once inaugurate the promised improvements.

MORE STREET PAVING ORDERED BY COUNCIL

SEVENTH STREET FROM OLIVE TO OAK AND NINTH STREET FROM OLIVE TO PEARL WILL BE IMPROVED

Council Passes Ordinance Covering These Streets—Desired to Also Pave Eighth and Oak Streets, But County Court Has Not Yet Acted Upon Petition

More street paving was ordered by the city council at its special meeting last night. Seventh street, from Olive to Oak, a distance of two blocks, and Ninth, from Olive to Pearl, a distance of three blocks, were ordered paved by ordinance, which was unanimously passed. The ordinance calls for bitulithic, bituminous macadam or asphalt, but it is altogether probable that the material will be bitulithic, the same as the Willamette street pavement, as the Warren Construction Company will doubtless be awarded the contract. It was desired to include Eighth street for a distance of three or four blocks and Oak street for a distance of two blocks, in the ordinance, but the county court has not yet acted upon the petition for it to consent to the paving of those portions of the street mentioned which border on the county grounds. As soon as the court consents an ordinance to cover these streets will be passed. If the present plans are carried out Eugene will have 18 blocks of paved streets before the present operations cease.

Cemetery Ordinance Lost.

The proposed ordinance to prevent the Odd Fellows from enlarging their cemetery was put upon its final passage, and lost by the following vote: Ayes—Calkins, Garrett, Harbaugh, Ayes—Fisher, Henderson, McCrady, Berger.

The New Water Plant.

The council ordered that a measurement of the flow of water on Ritchie creek, on the McKenzie river, and also of the Fall creek, be taken August 15. It was moved that an estimate on the cost of a preliminary survey for the Ritchie creek project be made.

The fire and water committee, with the city attorney, was instructed to draft an amendment in behalf of the proposed amendment to the city charter on the subject of bonding, and report to the council as a committee of the whole for their criticism or revision, and then to be published.

REFERENDUM CASE ON AUGUST SEVENTH

Salem, Or., July 22.—The supreme court has announced that the hearing for arguments in the famous referendum cases of Robert Stevens vs. F. W. Benson, secretary of state; John A. Logan vs. F. W. Benson and Eugene Palmer et al vs. F. W. Benson will be held August 7. These cases are on appeal from the judgment of William Galloway, circuit judge for Marion county, and relate to the referendum. Judge Galloway held that the petitions asking the referendum on these three measures were invalid because the warning clauses had not been properly prepared.
