OREGON TRUST BANK WILL SOON REOPEN

Portland, Dec. 31.—Unless present plans miscarry, the Oregon Trust & Savings Bank, which on August 21 failed for nearly \$2,500,000, will be reopened by the German-American Bank of this city, and will be merged with the latter institution.

The plan is said to hinge on the obtaining of an order from the courts which will enable the German-American Company to pay off the Oregon Trust depositors in installments. S. G. Reed, the treasurer of the Portland Railway, Light and Power Company, has been offered the presidency of the bank.

James Mankin, a farmer on the Sterling road, three miles from Jacksonville, was killed in a duel with shotguns and rifles Saturday evening. C. H. Walworth, a woodchopper, his assailant, was seriously wounded, but will recover, and his son, N. W. Walworth, was slightly wounded. The fight followed the serving of a notice upon the Walworths by Mankin to vacate the premises they occupied, belonging to the latter. Deputy Sheriff Grant placed the wounded men under arrest and brought them to Jacksonville. Dr. E. B. Pickle dressed their wounds.
