BERWICK DRIFTS ON SPIT AT SIUSLAW MOUTH

The Portland Journal tells of the grounding of the Berwick at the mouth of the Siuslaw as follows: Caught in the grasp of a 70-mile gale, the two-masted gasoline schooner Berwick, Captain Childs, drifted on the beach at the mouth of the Siuslaw river Friday night. The craft was bound from this port to Florence with a cargo of general merchandise. Word of the wreck reached here this morning.

The vessel lies on the north spit and is likely to remain there some time owing to the fact that she went on with the flood tide. The cargo was saved yesterday by means of lights, but the task was most difficult since the waves ran very high at times leaving the lighters pounding on the sands.

The Berwick left this port several weeks ago, after having discharged a cargo of frozen salmon from Rogue river and taken on a general cargo for Florence. She went out in command of a young man named Childs, owing to the fact that Captain Howditch, who recently relieved Captain Jacobson, fell down and broke one of his legs while boarding the vessel at the cold storage dock.

When about three days out the Berwick encountered a terrific gale that wrenched her rudder post and did other damage. After drifting about for more than a week Captain Childs finally tried to make Coos Bay for repairs. A second start was made but luck was no better and again the little craft received the attention of the enraged elements.

The Berwick carries a crew of from six to eight and occasionally a passenger or two. She is owned by Hume, the Rogue River salmon king.

ORCHARD IS ANXIOUS TO DIE FOR HIS CRIMES

Boise, Idaho, March 15.—On the morning of his 42d birthday, next Wednesday, in the district court of Canyon county, Harry Orchard, the self-confessed murderer of ex-Governor Steunenberg, who was killed by the explosion of a bomb at the gate of his residence in Caldwell on the evening of December 30, 1905, will face Judge Fremont Wood prepared to hear the death sentence meted out to him.

Harry Orchard, of his own volition and against the urgent pleadings of his attorney and others, refused to let his previous plea of not guilty stand when arraigned on March 10. He also refused to plead to a lesser degree of murder than first degree. He said:

"I am guilty and ready to take the punishment. I have told the truth. I understand fully what must be the consequences."

Among some expressions are made that they believe Orchard has been granted immunity of some sort. This is denied by those in authority and by Orchard himself. Those who have been in close communication with Orchard, prison authorities and those who have added spiritual comfort to the man, express the opinion that after being sentenced, should an effort be made to commute his sentence or pardon him, Orchard will refuse to accept it.

DARING ROBBER HOLDS UP TRAIN

Spokane, March 13.—Assuming all the airs and authority of a veteran postoffice inspector, a daring highwayman boarded the Great Northern westbound Oriental Limited train just as it pulled out of Bonners Ferry, Idaho, early this morning, and holding the two mail clerks at bay at the point of a revolver, locked one of them in the clothes closet and tied the other to a chair with ropes, after which he rode a distance of 109 miles into Spokane, spending three hours and forty minutes rifling registered mail, loading and unloading mail sacks along the route and puffing complacently at a cigar the while.

The lone robber dropped off the train at a railroad crossing inside the city limits, carrying with him, it is believed, much valuable plunder in a satchel. Just how much he obtained is not definitely known.
