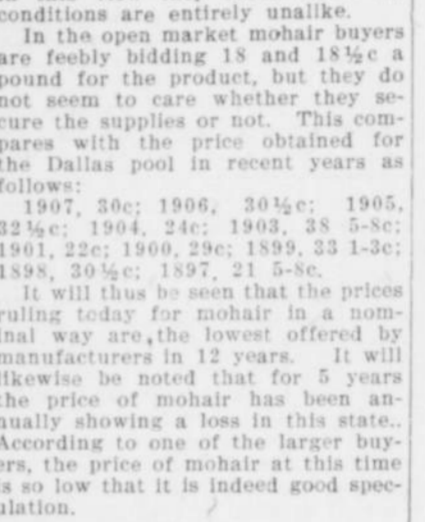

WOOL GROWERS OF UTAH WILL FIGHT.

The storage of the clip at Boston is the outgrowth of the determination of the Utah sheepmen to oppose the brokerage combine, which this year offered 10 cents the pound, 12 3-4 lower than the 1907 quotation. The sheepmen complained and certain concessions were made, the highest offering, however, being 15 cents for a limited quantity of wool.

The Utah association sent a committee to Boston to arrange for storage and the advance of money in order that growers might successfully continue business without disposing of the clip at a loss. The committee was highly successful and Saturday's meeting will be the culmination of the fight.
