

VISITORS WILL

BE ASSURED OF HEARTY WELCOME

(Guard Special Service.)

Seattle, Wash., May 12.—Visitors to Seattle during the coming reception and entertainment of the Atlantic Battleship Fleet, which will arrive in this city on the afternoon of May 23, are assured that they will not only receive the welcome of the city, and be afforded a long program of splendid entertainment, but are also certain they will not be subjected to extortionate prices by the hotels and restaurants of the city. The Seattle Hotel and Restaurant Keeper's Association has announced that all of its members have signed an agreement not to raise above their present scale of prices during the visit of the fleet. All the leading restaurants and hotels in the city are members of this association, and the agreement not to raise prices will practically cover all the cafes usually patronized by visitors.

Arrangements are being perfected to provide plenty of seating accommodations of spectators at the time of the great land parade, May 26. In addition to the number of small stands that will be erected by private parties, an enormous grand stand will be built at the reviewing point on Second Avenue. The stand will have reserved seats for 15,000 persons and applications are now coming in rapidly for tickets. The committee has announced that a certain number of seats will be reserved for out of town spectators who desire to see the parade from this point.

Applications for seats can be sent by mail to A. F. Doversaas, care of the Seattle Chamber of Commerce and the tickets will be mailed as soon as printed. Purchasers should enclose \$1.00 for each seat wanted.

Great interest is being taken in the program of athletic and aquatic sports for the afternoons of May 25 and 26th. These events will be of particular interest to visitors as they will take place in locations where an excellent view of all contests can be obtained.

The aquatic sports are to be on the bay, and arrangements are under way to obtain the use of the decks of the battleships as viewing points for the visitors. A number of barges will be fitted up by ship owners and a fleet of excursion boats will also make special trips to the scene of the races and other events.

The athletic meet and barbecue in the large playgrounds at Woodland Park will afford plenty of room for thousands of spectators to see the events in comfort.

One of the most interesting features of the water sports will be a log rolling contest for the championship of the Northwest, in which experts will enter from all over the Northwest.

BAND SAWS SUPPLANT THE CIRCULAR ONES

Many of the larger sawmills of California are now employing "band" saws instead of circular saws. Band saws are proving especially advantageous in the sawing of big logs, as they do the work more quickly and with far less waste than the circular saws. These band saws are long ribbons of steel, from six to eight inches in width, operate over large pulleys above and below, the upper pulley being located directly over the lower. The principle on which these saws operate is exactly like that of the small band saws employed in planing and finishing mills. The saws are necessarily thin, and made of the very toughest steel. Each has a daily capacity of from 30,000 to 40,000 feet, and requires from 25 to 40 per cent less power than circular saws of the same capacity. To prevent heating a small stream of water is continually played upon the band saw. At first there was considerable hesitancy in adopting them, as they were considered extremely dangerous on account of their liability to break. It has been found, however, that there is no more danger of their breaking than that of the circular saw. Unlike the circular saw, the band saw carries its own teeth, these being a part of the saw itself. Each mill must therefore be provided with several extras, so that these may be in the process of sharpening and setting while the other is at work.
