**LARGE VOTE BEING CAST AT TODAY'S ELECTION**

(From Monday's Guard.)  
The battle of ballots is on and when the smoke clears away tomorrow we shall know who is who in politics. Locally the election is one of the quietest ever held here, but a record-breaking vote is being polled. The people seem to have made up their minds how they want to vote and they are casting their ballots accordingly. A good many carriages were on the streets carrying voters to and from the polls, but nobody had to be urged to get out and vote, as all were interested in the outcome of the election.  
Locally the fight centers principally on the office of sheriff, Drew Griffin being the nominee of the Republicans and Harry Bown of the Democrats. In Eugene it appears to be a close fight, and the vote will probably be close in the county at large. There is also a sharp contest for the office of county clerk, Henry Stewart, the Democratic nominee, having a very strong following, although the dopesters don't think he will be able to overcome Clerk Lee's usual majority. The fight is quite warm also on the legislative ticket, and it appears to be a toss-up between the regular Republican nominees and the Statement No. 1 ticket. Allen H. Eaton is the nominee of both sides and will doubtless go in easily, although he said there is a split among the Republicans over him.  
The wets and dries are both working hard and each side seems confident of victory. The dries gave their children's parade again this morning, but that did no good for the reason that everybody had their minds made up on the subject some good reason figures out that the county will go wet this time, while there are others who say the dry conditions of the past two years have converted many who before were in favor of the saloon, and the county will go dry by a larger majority than two years ago, which was something over 200.

The voting started heavy from the first, and at all the polling places crowds were kept waiting in line nearly all day, the officers of election being kept on the jump preparing the ballots and transcribing the names of the voters on the election sheets. A good many voters who failed to register were sworn in at the polls the Republicans and Democrats each maintaining headquarters during the day to make out the papers for that purpose. The Republicans held forth at the office of Justice of the Peace Bryson and the Democrats at the office of L. M. Travis, chairman of the Democratic central committee, who has directed the campaign for his party.

**OREGON VICTOR IN TRI-STATE MEET AT SEATTLE**

Seattle, Wash., May 30.—Oregon won an overwhelming victory in the tri-state intercollegiate meet here today, scoring more points than Idaho and Washington combined, and establishing a clear title to the championship of Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Montana. The Oregon team scored 64 points out of a total of 122, while Idaho was a fair second with 35, and Washington a poor third with 23. The Oregon men had a walk-over, and won a number of the events without scoring themselves.  
Edmundson, Idaho's great runner, was the star of the meet, winning the 440, 880 and mile runs, and running the fastest lap in the relay race, won by Idaho. Edmundson's work in today's meet brands him as the greatest distance runner ever seen in the Northwest. Vernon, of Wash., gave the Idaho man some hard competition in the 880 and mile events, and Lowell, of Oregon, ran him a hard race in the 440-yard run, but the Idaho man seemed to be invincible, and always put on a burst of speed that brought him to the tape ahead of his rivals.  
Huston and Moon Win Easily  
Huston and Moon, of Oregon, had no trouble winning the sprints, while Kuykendall and Huston were easy winners over Montgomery, of Idaho, in the hurdles. Kuykendall won the broad jump with comparative ease, and Zacharias was high man in the hammer throw. Moulton, of Oregon, was another star, winning the shot-put and scoring points in both the high jump and pole-vault.  
No records were broken, but the meet was interesting and was witnessed by a big crowd. By winning today's meet, Oregon established her claim to the Northwest championship for the third consecutive season.
