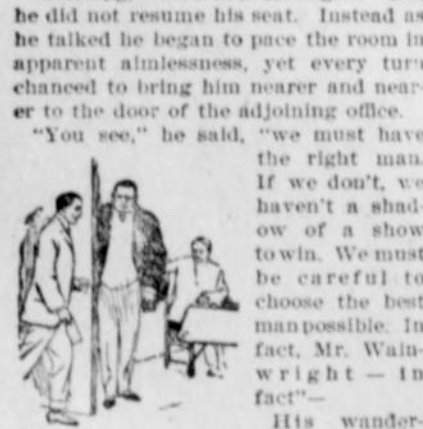
LANE-DOUGLAS TEACHERS TO MEET TOGETHER
