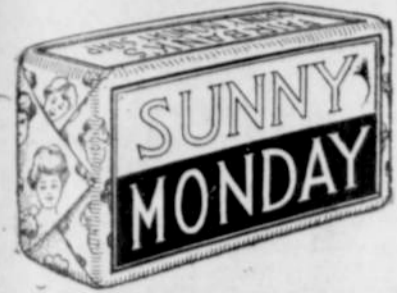

CASE AGAINST G. M. WHITSON IS DISMISSED

G. M. Whitson, the cotamercial traveler who forged several checks and passed them upon the Hotel Smeede and the Chambers Hardware Company here several months ago, and who has been in the county jail

here for the past two or three months, having been arrested at Walla Walla shortly after the commission of the crime, was discharged from custody by Judge Harris, of the circuit court, this morning upon motion of the district attorney. The reason for this action is that the prosecution deemed that the ends of justice

had been served already in that Whitson had made good the amount obtained by his forgeries, had paid the costs, amounting to over \$100, and has spent a good length of time in jail

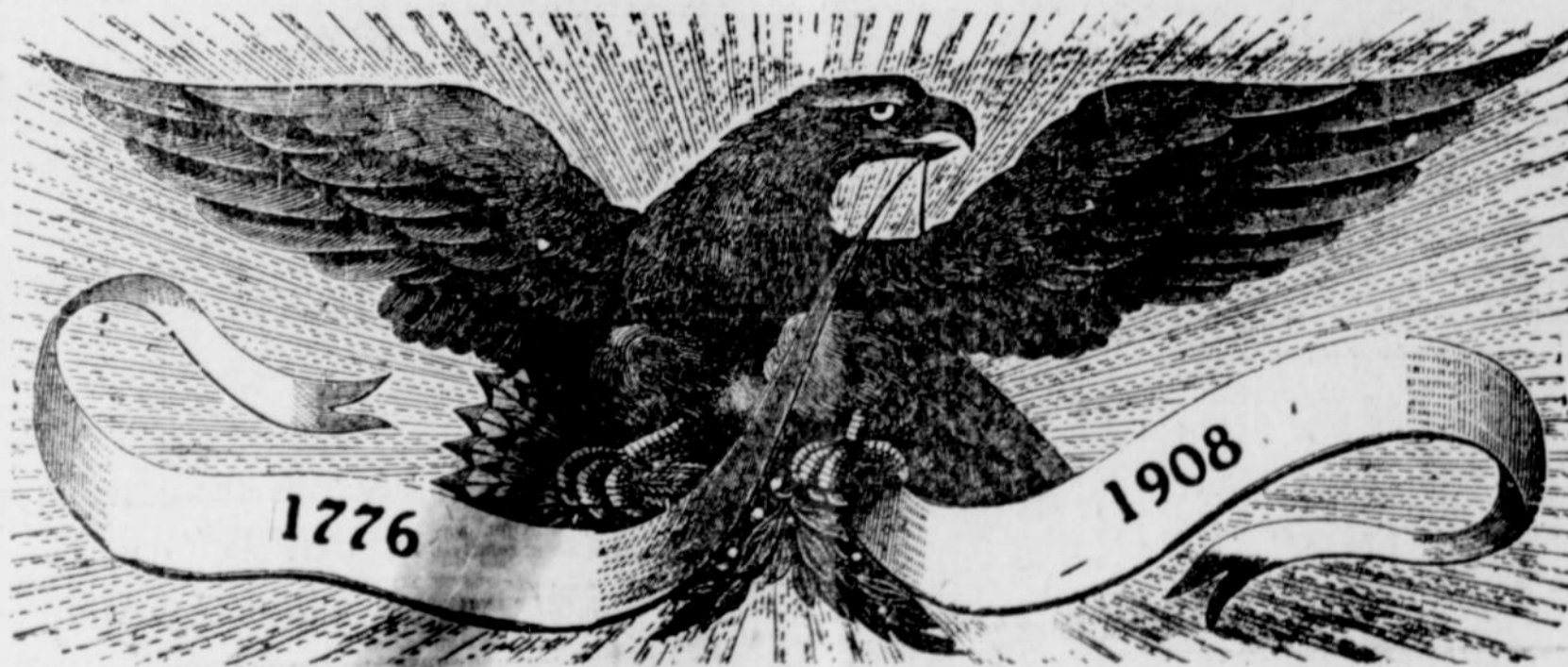
