In fact, it looked a bit blue for the champion as he strode to his seat after the termination of the second round. In two fast rounds Kelly out-fought his man from the tap of the gong.

**CARVER'S RAILROAD  
READY FOR BUSINESS**

**WILL HAUL WHEAT FROM FARMS  
ALONG LINE TO CORVALLIS  
THIS FALL—TRACKLAYING IN  
PROGRESS**

The Corvallis & Asea Railroad expects to be in the field to handle the grain crop of Southern Benton, and will be ready to supply cars to farmers the latter part of next week, says the Corvallis Times. The track has been laid and is now in good condition to a distance 15 1/2 miles, and will be at Barclay's within a few days. The grade has been pushed forward to the Benson Starr farm, a distance of 15 miles. Both tracklaying and grading is in progress every day. A siding to the Corvallis Flouring Mills is being rushed, and will be ready for use next week. Manager Carver announced last night that all facilities would be offered farmers to get their grain to Corvallis over the new road. Only such grain as is destined for Corvallis will be received, no arrangement being perfected as yet to carry it to other points. The company will leave cars on the main line at any point to accommodate farmers for the present, the only requirement being that the car shall be loaded during the day. The arrangement will be very convenient to those who wish to ship to Corvallis, reducing as it will the haul to the minimum.

AN IMMENSE PROFIT  
IN CALIFORNIA**

Sacramento, Cal., July 31.—The Southern Pacific Co. in this state during the year ending on the first Monday in March last earned a profit of \$809,016.50. That sum represents the gross net earnings of the Harriman lines in California for 12 months.

E. B. Ryan, of the Southern Pacific, reported the foregoing to the State Board of Equalization today. He also submitted a statement showing that the Central Pacific, after paying all expenses, had a surplus on the first Monday in March of \$4,653,184.89. That makes Harriman's earnings from the two roads total \$15,382,801.39.
