which this corporation intends it to be used.

Such a company is able to do much toward the encouragement of such enterprises as railroads, and the construction of a line from Eugene to the mouth of the Siuslaw will probably be among the first things to be taken up by the corporation. Stephen Carver, who is building a line out of Corvallis toward the Lake Creek valley, in Lane county, has written Mr. Dunn, one of the incorporators, that he will be here about the 10th of this month to talk over the matter of extending the line to Eugene.

It is learned that a move will soon be made by the company to obtain

rights-of-way, terminals, etc., for a railroad from Eugene to the Siuslaw and offer them to any corporation or individual who will guarantee to build a road within a certain time.
