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authoritative books on subjects relating to the Far East, contributes to the October number of the North American Review a suggestive article, in which he expresses his opinion as to "What Our Fleet Could Do for China."

"It has been calculated that the results of this treaty going into force would roughly be to double the present annual Chinese customs revenues of thirty million gold dollars, thus allowing the service of all Chinese debts and indemnities to become practically unified by their being drawn from the same source, and also giving directly to the Peking government—as distinguished from the provincial governments—a handsome annual surplus from which to take the sums necessary for a gradual naval and military reconstruction.

"But this treaty manifestly could not go into force, as regards any of its essential clauses, without all treaty powers concluding identical treaties."
