ABE RUEF DECLARED GUILTY BY JURY

Bulletin—At 4 o'clock this afternoon the jury brought in a verdict of guilty, after having been out for twenty-four hours. San Francisco, Dec. 10.—Nineteen hours have elapsed since the jury in the Abe Ruef case began their deliberations and up to eleven o'clock today there was nothing to indicate what was transpiring behind the closed doors of the jury room, except a request for further instructions at midnight last night. Ruef's attorneys are hopeful, and the impression is that two or three jurors are in favor of acquittal. At one o'clock today, the jury was out after twenty-one hours' deliberation.
