JUDGE BEAN APPOINTED TO NEW FEDERAL JUDGESHIP CREATED BY CONGRESS

Washington, April 15.—President Taft today nominated Robert S. Bean for United States district judge for Oregon; Thomas R. Lyons to be United States district judge for the first district of Alaska; Daniel A. Sutherland to be United States marshal for the first district of Alaska.

The appointment of Judge Bean to the federal judgeship will leave a vacancy on the state supreme court bench, and there is a strong sentiment throughout this part of Oregon in favor of Judge Harris, whose appointment is being strongly urged upon Governor Benson.

Private advices from Salem this afternoon are to the effect that McBride has been tendered and has accepted the appointment.

The New Appointment. Robert Sharp Bean, the new federal judge, is a native Oregonian, having first seen the light of day in Yamhill county, November 8, 1854.

His father, O. R. Bean, was a native of Missouri, and came to the Oregon country in 1852, settling in the county in which his illustrious son was born. Judge Bean's father married Miss Julia A. Sharp the year in which he arrived in this state. The youth of our eminent jurist was spent upon the farm, where he toiled in summer and in the winter his work was chiefly that of storing his mind, improving such educational facilities as the district school of that time afforded. In September, 1869, he entered Monmouth college, from which he was graduated in 1873. In 1874 he took up the study of law with the late Hon. J. M. Thompson, of Eugene, and was admitted to the bar in 1876. Shortly afterward he formed a partnership with his tutor, which partnership continued until the death of Judge Thompson, which occurred in 1882.

Judge Bean is a member of Eugene Lodge No. 11, Eugene Chapter No. 10, and Ivanhoe Commandery, F. & A. M. He has ever been a staunch supporter of his adopted city, always on the lookout for that which would conduce to the welfare and the good of his many friends, and neighbors.

His promotion to the federal bench will come as a piece of good news to his many friends here in Eugene, as well as all over the state where Judge Bean is known.

OBITUARY.

For the last fifteen years previous to her death, she made her home with her granddaughter, Mrs. Carey Thomson, at Vida, Oregon. She became a member of the Baptist church at the age of 22 years and had lived the life of a Christian ever since.
