OREGON TEAM LEAVES ON TRIP TOWASHINGTON

The eyes of the entire Northwest are now turned toward the coming football battle between the teams of the Northwest, and who have employed two vastly different systems of coaching. The final championship game between Oregon and Washington at Seattle next Thursday will decide the much-disputed superiority of the development of players individually, and trying and fitting his men first, and then at the very last working his

all-star men into the perfect machine, over Douie's Middle West style of producing team work and individual coaching at the same time and from the first.

The game will be a splendid opportunity to try out the systems, for although Washington will have the advantage of a home field, Oregon's men will be nearly all in good condition. Washington is the picked winner for this game, principally because the method of which all do not realize, give Washington the best by comparative scores, for while the Northern team was piling up unusual scores against her opponents, from the first Oregon was only running up safe margins. Instead of picking one team and forcing its development, Forbes developed a large number of men to their highest efficiency and then chose his team.

Twenty-one Oregon football players with expressions of confident determination, accompanied by Bill Hayward and "Boh" Forbes and their wives, left on today's noon train for American Lake, where they will rest for the final game on Thanksgiving day with the University of Washington at Seattle.

The men that left were Kellogg, Carey, Bailey, Harding, Pichha, Scott, Neams, Main, Kiltz, Dodson, Michael, Hickson, Johnson, Huston, Lacourette, Chandler, McKinty, Taylor, Sullivan, Walker and Clark.

The object of going down today is to avoid a long and tiresome trip just before the game, and by that time to acustom themselves to the Northern climate and ground. The members of the team lose only two days of school by this because of the vacation. Altogether this year the boys will have missed only five days. This is unusually low. The work is all made up by a special arrangement.

All the men will be in good shape. Dan Mitchell could not go with the team because of a dislocated knee, the injury having been received yesterday. Clark's ankle is expected to be in good shape by that time. During the few minutes he played yesterday he saw that it was not strong enough and he wisely quit. The tendons are somewhat swollen today.

OREGON LAWYERS AND LEGISLATION

Declaring that the people have lost respect for the constitution and that the initiative is a failure in Oregon, President Wirt Minor precipitated a storm in the closing hours of the convention of the Oregon Bar Association yesterday. Following Mr. Minor's surrender of the floor, Judge Martin L. Pipes secured recognition and declared that through newspaper criticism both the bench and the bar of the state are now under public condemnation.

Immediately following the close of the discussion the Bar Association declared its intention of scrutinizing closely all initiative measures which may be submitted to the voters of the state in November in 1910. It will meet in Portland on the third Tuesday in May and at that time will be armed with copies of all the initiative petitions which may have been circulated in the state. It proposes to examine closely their provisions and probable effect, and after a thorough discussion the association will advise the voters of the state. It is probable that an official paper will be selected and at the same time arrangements will be made for the maintenance of a permanent committee of the state capital. The duties of the committee will be to examine all bills introduced and to offer legislative committees its advice as to their form and effect.

Second Choice Law Opposed. It is probable that the committee will oppose the enactment of legislation designed to carry into effect the recent constitutional amendment providing for the notation of first, second and third choices for public offices, as being in conflict with what is asserted to be a cardinal principle of the constitution, the rule of a majority.

President Minor ridiculed many of the acts of the late General Assembly as being ill advised and as having been adopted without proper study of their contents or effects, referring particularly to the action of that body in passing seven bills over the veto of the governor.

Fulton Secures Heney. In speaking of the report that Francis J. Heney had been appointed an assistant attorney-general to prosecute land-fraud cases in Oregon, the speech of ex-Senator Charles W. Fulton, before 300 members of the Oregon Bar association yesterday created a sensation.

He said the appellate court did only its duty when it reversed the verdict of guilty against former Mayor Schmitz of San Francisco. Fulton said in part:

"I state without any reservation whatever, as a result of careful reading and consideration of the decision, that had the court failed to decide as it did, it would have disgraced itself as the judiciary of the country. They could not have decided otherwise without violating their official oaths and pleading guilty to a degree of cowardice and pusillanimity that would have justly earned for them the enduring contempt of the bench and bar of the nation."

"I do not contend that the record disclosed the innocence of Schmitz. I do contend, however, that he was entitled to a fair and impartial trial and that the records disclosed not only that he had been denied such, but that the character of the trial in the lower court, in its utter disregard of the most simple and elementary principles of justice and decency, was rarely, if ever, surpassed by Jeffrey in his most vigorous and vicious examples of judicial tyranny and depravity."

WILLAMETTE RIVER AND TRIBUTARIES SPREAD OVER LARGE AREA FARMING LAND

(From Tuesday's Daily Guard.)

Flood conditions prevail in the entire Willamette Valley as a result of the almost unprecedented rainfall during the past few days. For the 24 hours ending at 8 o'clock this morning the precipitation was 1.34 inches, and for the day previous it was 1.89 inches, making a total of 3.14 inches for the two days. Great banks of snow in the mountains have melted, and it has been carried down to the valleys in the streams in the shape of water at a tremendous rate.

The present rise in the Willamette is higher by two or three inches than the rise of 1907, and is said to equal a number of freshets of ten or twelve years ago. This forenoon at 11 o'clock the water was over the top of the gauge, which registers 21 feet. Some think it went as high as 22 feet, while others are of the opinion that it was no higher than 21 1/2 feet.

Record for Past Few Years

The record for the past few years is as follows: February 15, 1904, 17 feet; January 4, 1907, 19 feet; February 5, 1907, 21 1/2 feet; December 25, 1907, 19 feet; January 13, 1908, 16 feet. It is said that in 1899 it was as high as 23 or 24 feet, but there are no official records to substantiate the statement. During the great flood of 1899 or thereabouts the river was still higher than that, nearly the whole city being inundated at that time.

A Vast Lake

As far as the eye can see through the brush and tree tops north of the river the water covers the ground and in places above the city the country between the McKenzie and Willamette rivers is as a vast lake, the two rivers being joined. Farmers north of the city, of course, are unable to reach town, and some in the bottom country along the river are completely hemmed in and cannot get out of their houses at all. There is doubtless considerable loss of small stock and some cattle and horses may be drowned.

Springfield Flooded

The city of Springfield is suffering from the high water much more than Eugene is. A report from there early this morning stated that there was two feet of water in Main street, and nearly all of the stores were flooded. It was impossible to telephone to any one there all during the forenoon for the reason that the floor of the telephone station there was covered with water a foot deep. This water did not come from an overflow of the river at Springfield, but from several miles above where the river overflowed and great volumes of water poured down upon the city by that route.

The Booth-Kelly sawmill was idle all day because the men could not reach the plant. There was not a train moving over there all day on account of the water covering the tracks.

Along the bottom between Eugene and Springfield there is the usual large amount of water and the P. E. & E. tracks were covered for a short distance. It was reported that a section of fill just in front of the Walker residence was washed out. Cars ran only as far as Judkin's Point during the day.

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
