

SERIOUS DANGER

OF HAY SHORTAGE

On Account of Cold Weather
Farmers Had to Feed Stock

—Market Notes—

There is serious danger of a hay shortage before the winter is over, because of the past few cold weeks, when the farmers have had to feed their stock, and it is fortunate that the cold wave has been broken. There is almost no hay coming in and the farmers nearly all admit that they have no more than enough to last them through the winter. The cold has stopped the grass growing, and all the animals have had to be put in the barn. There has been only a small demand for hay so far, but soon horse and cow owners around town will be calling for more.

The new railroad is draining the county of nearly all the feed east of here. The price of hay may reach a record this year.

Shortage is scarce at present, but this is periodic, for the local mills do not turn enough wheat into this feed. It costs too much to ship it from Portland, and besides, the brand received from there is very inferior to the product of the local mills.

Potatoes Going Up

Potatoes have gone up another notch, standing now between 6 and 7. There are many still in the ground, but there is a scarcity that will hold a strong price, and the present figures will be low compared to those of the coming months.

Other Market Notes

Oranges have dropped to \$3.25 and \$3.00, and will continue to slowly lower as the season advances. Onions, although there seems to be no scarcity, have risen to \$1.75. This is only natural as a recompense for holding.

Chickens and Turkeys. There are almost no turkeys and chickens coming into Eugene, and it seems as though the holiday season has cleaned the surrounding country of both. The latter have dropped to 10c, but turkeys are still at 21c. The price in the cities is very high and the demand beyond the supply.

It is estimated that there were 4,000 turkeys shipped out of Eugene during the 1939 holidays. This gives Eugene quite a reputation as a turkey raising center. This is the largest number ever shipped from here. But as a result, the country about is badly drained. There was a tendency to sell too quickly, as though the farmers were afraid of the price dropping.

PORTLAND MARKET REPORT.

Portland, Or., Dec. 29.—The grain market is decidedly of a holiday character. The few transactions taking place involve but small quantities showing the business to be of a hand-to-mouth nature. The California demand for wheat has subsided for the present and the only inquiry now

comes from the country millers. As there is no pressing need to buy and but little competition, some of the stiffness has disappeared from the market. The undertone is still firm, however, as the sellers are not disposed to make concessions. What dealers consider fair prices are \$1.20 for bluestem and \$1.10 for club.

Holders of oats and barley show as much firmness as ever and offerings are on a small scale, but at the same time the demand is temporarily light. The hay market holds steady. Receipts of late have been adequate but have cleared up well. The trade is much interested in the progress, or lack of progress, of the Ellensburg deal. It is not likely to affect this market, however, as the Yakima hay is held at a price which prevents it being put on this market.

The floor trade is normal for this time of year. The market is strong and some talk is heard of a probable advance soon, but no definite announcement of it has been made.

Bidding for 1910 Oregon Wool. Buyers have begun to make offers for the 1910 Oregon wool clip. The Pilot Rock Record says:

"J. N. Burgess, in his last annual message as president of the Oregon Woolgrowers' Association, laid stress upon two points. First, he advised the members of the association to retain sales dry and not to sell their wool before the dates set; second, not to contract to sell the wool or sheep until the buyers from the East have had an opportunity to bid. That there was a necessity for such advice is already evident for there has already been at least one bid made for the coming wool crop. G. F. Jones of Butter Creek, being the man to whom the offer was made and 20 cents per pound being the price offered."

"Instances are rare where the first prices offered are the best of the season. The buyers generally start with the low price and keep raising it as the season advances."

The woolgrowers of Oregon are better organized than ever before, and are in a position to get the best prices there are going. They would do well to again read the advice proffered by Mr. Burgess and act upon it."

Butter and Cheese Steady. In the butter market best city and country creamery continues moderate firm at the last quotations as a result of very light offerings.

On the other hand there is a slightly easier feeling in the case of Eastern products, but as yet prices are fairly well maintained and there is no assurance of any decline in the near future. The trend of butter prices at this time of the year is usually upward rather than downward.

The outlook is for higher cheese prices about the end of the year, with considerable shipments this way of Eastern stock. Current home make cuts but a small factor in the market.

The egg supply, regardless of the reported freezing of immense quantities

of Eastern stock in transit, continues adequate, and the market for the time is but little changed. Best Oregon eggs are held at 40 to 42 cents and Easterners at 25 to 33 cents.

Fair Demand for Potatoes.

A fair demand for fancy Oregon Burbank potatoes is reported in the South, and on the strength of this local buyers for shipment are paying 75 to 85 cents a hundred for choice stock. As yet they are buying only in a moderate way, for the demand is still limited and the growers having stock ready for the market are firm in their views regarding future values. That there are considerable quantities of potatoes still in the ground in this state is to some extent a bullish market factor, and some improvement in the demand south, when the bulk of the river stock is out of the way, is counted as reasonably certain a few weeks hence. A good demand for seed stock, Garnet Chiles, American Wonders and Early Rose, is reported in Southern California, and for these local dealers are paying around \$1 a hundred.

Portland Livestock Market.

Portland Union Stockyards, Stockdale, Or., Dec. 29.—The market for swine continues to show excellent form and sales were made during the past 24 hours as high as \$8.70. One lot that averaged 239 pounds brought this figure.

Strength of the swine market is amply shown by the very liberal values obtainable for common stock. Pigs sold in the yards as high as \$7. One lot of 30 head that averaged 64 pounds brought this figure.

Cattle Holding Steady. Market for cattle is holding steady in the yards and cows, which formed the only arrivals in that line recently, have been moved as high as \$3.75.

Demand for calves remains good, and sales are still being made at the former range.

Portland Livestock Market.

The following is the general range of livestock values in the yards: Cattle—Best steers, weighing 1200 pounds, \$4.75 to \$4.85; medium steers, 450; best cows, \$4.75 to \$4.85; fancy heifers, \$4.75 to \$4.85; medium cows, \$3.50; poor cows, \$2.50 to \$2.60; bulls, \$2.50 to \$2.60; Hogs—Best east of mountains, \$8.75 to \$8.85; fancy, \$8.65; stockers, \$8.00; pigs, \$6.00 to \$6.10. Sheep—Best wethers, \$5.25 to \$5.50; ordinary, \$5.00; spring lambs, \$6.00; straight ewes, \$4.75; mixed lots, \$4.75 to \$5.00; Calves—Best, \$5.25 to \$5.50; ordinary, \$5.00 to \$5.25.
