LANE POMONA GRANGE OPPOSED TO ASSEMBLY

Also Resolves in Favor of Road District Bonding Law for Improvement

(Special Correspondence.)

Irving, Feb. 2.—Lane Pomona Grange met in Irving Saturday, Jan. 29. Representatives from most of the Granges in the county were in attendance, some of them traveling miles over roads that at this season of the year are almost impassable, which proves their loyalty to the Grange. It was one of the most interesting and profitable sessions Lane Pomona has yet held. Many important questions were discussed and resolutions passed which were as follows:

Resolved, that Lane's Pomona Grange in regular session assembled oppose the assembly plan of suggesting candidates and that we will look with disfavour on all candidates so suggested, and that a copy be sent to the press of Lane county and to the Grange bulletin.
Resolved, that the building and maintaining of good roads be the most pressing question now before the Oregon farmer and that the proper solution of this question will do more to develop our undeveloped resources than any other one thing and believing that the road law is insufficient in that it provides no adequate way of collecting enough money at any one time.

Resolved, be it resolved by Lane Pomona Grange in regular session at Irving, Jan. 29, 1910, that the legislative committee of Lane Grange State Grange is requested to prepare a bill to have it passed at the next session of the Oregon legislature and to advise the grange pending road law and to have a combination of districts to have themselves for a sufficient number to make such permanent improvements as the majority of reduced land owners of such districts or combination of districts may deem necessary or expedient.

The main feature being an address by Hon. Hiram W. Thompson, on the subject of good roads, the at this season of the year is especially interesting to the Grangers. It was a very interesting and instructive address and was enjoyed by all present.

At the close of the open session the Worthy Master took the chair and the rest of the afternoon was spent in a routine of business. Supper was again served in the hall and an evening session held and the class initiated to the fifth degree. Pleasant Hill Grange extended an invitation to the Lane Pomona to meet with them the next Saturday in April which was accepted.

Lane Pomona is now one year old and has had a steady and substantial growth since it was first organized. It has grown in interest as well as members and we believe that during the coming year it will more than double its present membership.
