BASEBALL TEAM IS STRENGTHENED

Springfield, April 21.—Manager Elmer Cox, of the Springfield baseball team this morning signing up a new man to fill the place of Welch second base, who will be unable to play with the team this summer because of conflicting engagements. The man is Ryan, who played second with Albina last year in the Tri-City League. Springfield is very ready to sign him; for he is an unusually good pick-up. He will be up here in a day or so, and work out with the boys a few times. Ryan is long on hard hitting, and knows the game well.

Manager Cox is very much pleased with the showing that his "army" made Sunday, and has great hopes for the valley pennant. He feels that Eugene's bunch is not as fast as many have expected, and that Albany will be the hardest competitor. Elmer admits modestly that the victory Sunday was only baseball luck, and that he has a fight on his hands every time he meets Albany. The game with Cottage Grove next Sunday does not seem to worry him any, but yet Springfield will be prepared for a stiff game, for judging from Sunday's game they have lots of fight and little quit in them.

Springfield really has a splendid chance this season to make the top of the league, for besides having almost the same team as last year, and Elmer Cox's judgment and luck in picking up men and winning the first game, there are other reasons for her success. Springfield is one of the hardest teams in the valley. There is no better field in the state. In Schermer, in the box, is the team's most valuable man. He not only has a wide assortment of breaks and twists, but he knows every batter in the league and can deal out just the right ball to make the man play to his disadvantage. He has won all the men's style of hitting, because he has played with nearly all of them at one time or another on the same team.

TO RESTORE RATE

Salem, Or., April 20.—The Southern Pacific company has been requested by the railroad commission, as a result of the agitation started by the open river convention at Albany, to restore its arbitrary rate on transcontinental freight shipments. If the railroad company refuses the matter will be taken up in a formal manner by the commission. The 10 per cent arbitrary rate between Portland and valley points was abolished March 23 and a differential rate substituted.

HEARST ENDORSES

PRESIDENT TAFT

Former Democrat and Independence Leaguer Issues Statement

Washington, April 20.—William Randolph Hearst, former aspirant for the Democratic nomination for the Presidency, tonight issued a remarkable statement over his own signature, in which he unqualifiedly endorsed Mr. Taft.

In doing so he also criticizes in severe terms the administration of President Roosevelt, and in so many words warns the American nation against a renewal of the political domination of the ex-president.

Mr. Hearst called at the White House this afternoon. He spent half

an hour with the president. Upon leaving, Mr. Hearst said he had called merely to pay his respects to Mr. Taft, whom he said he admired. Later he issued his endorsement of the Taft administration.

"No one can talk with the president without appreciating and respecting his earnestness and sincerity," the statement says. "Personally I believe also in his efficiency. He has been one year in the office and he certainly has accomplished more in that year than Roosevelt did in his first year."

"It is hardly fair to compare Taft's one year with Roosevelt's seven, and yet, I am not sure even with that, the comparison might not be to Taft's advantage. Taft's methods are not those of Roosevelt, but then Taft will probably not conclude his term with a panic."

"On the whole, it seems to me a quiet, earnest gentleman who came into office when the country was in the slough of adversity and after one year in office has placed the country on the high road of prosperity, is quite as valuable a president as a more showy and spectacular person who found the country in the height of prosperity and left it in the depths of adversity."

Mr. Hearst admits he does not charge Mr. Roosevelt directly for the panic of 1907, nor does he undertake to give Mr. Taft the entire credit for the restoration of prosperity. He declares, however, that an administration which is producing more dividends for business men and finding work for the unemployed, "should not be too carpingly criticized for certain minor faults of omission or commission."

Taft is carrying out Roosevelt's policy in the one way that they ought to be carried out. That is to say, he is doing things that Roosevelt should have done, but did not do.

"Taft is making the railroad rate complete and effective. The Roosevelt railroad rate act has always been an utter failure, and everything who knew anything about the subject knew when it passed that it was a failure and would be a failure."

"At any rate, Mr. Hepburn, the gentleman who was selected by the Roosevelt administration to stand sponsor for that bill in the house, has been but lately hunting in effigy by his constituents for too great friendliness to the railroads."

"Would you have returned that kind of man, tagged with that kind of testimonial, to frame that kind of a bill? And can you imagine Mr. Roosevelt, the Diogenes of politics, hunting through the house of congress, lantern in hand, to find an honest man, and selecting this executed effigy as the fittest one to frame the people's railroad bill?"

LODGES WILL BUILD

AT COTTAGE GROVE

Masons, Odd Fellows, Woodmen and Knights of Pythias Active

Cottage Grove, April 19.—The season's building activity and improvement has begun in earnest, and while 1909 saw the completion of fully 100 new buildings in Cottage Grove, this record will be broken before the close of 1910.

The Masonic lodge has purchased the Eakin and Bristow property on Wall and A streets, with a frontage of 40x100 feet, for \$4500. This property carries a substantial one-story brick building, and the Masons will build a second story and make improvements at a total outlay of about \$10,000. This building is occupied by the Oregon National Guard, and will probably still be its home, the second story, when completed, to be used for lodge purposes.

F., which is contemplating the erection of a three-story brick building at a cost of about \$10,000 or \$12,000, and the Knights of Pythias and Woodmen of the World recently secured a 50-foot lot opposite the Lawson building and will begin the erection of a brick building in a month or six weeks, at an outlay of about \$11,000. These buildings will all have modern conveniences.

Cement sidewalks on Main street from the bridge across the Coast Fork river to the S. P. depot, a distance of about six blocks, are taking the place of board walks, and will be completed by May 1. The paving of Main street is under consideration by the city council, which favors this improvement and has invited the paving companies to send representatives here. Mayor Kime has ordered all shacks and unsightly buildings removed from Main street and the city in general cleaned up.

WILL LOG SECTION OF NATIONAL FOREST
Fir Lumber Company Will Build Short Railway Line and Mill

Cottage Grove, Or., April 19.—The Fir Lumber Company, with a capitalization of \$50,000, and Messrs. A. B. Wood, J. H. Chambers and J. B. Protzman as incorporators, has filed articles of incorporation with the secretary of state, and will inaugurate logging operations on an extensive scale within the next 90 days. The Fir Lumber Company is the name selected by the incorporators, who recently purchased 175,000,000 feet of standing timber in the National forest reserve, paying \$2.50 per 1000 feet. A logging railroad will be constructed from the Oregon & Southeastern Railroad terminus, 21 miles east of here, to this vast body of timber, a distance of two and one-half miles, where operations will begin. The survey has been made and contracts let for construction material. The company will erect and operate a mill probably at this place, of about 100,000 feet per day capacity, to convert it to a vast body of timber, a distance of two and one-half miles, where operations will begin. 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
