

BONNETT BROS. MAY BUILD THREE STORIES

It is reported that Bonnett Bros., who have begun work on their new block on West Ninth street between Willamette and Olive, may build three stories instead of two and that a large Portland firm may establish a branch store here, using all three floors of this building.

A member of the firm of Bonnett Bros., when asked as to the truth of this report today, neither denied nor affirmed it, but stated that they were going ahead with their building and would have it completed by early fall.

The Portland firm that is said to be contemplating entering the local field has furniture for its principal line of goods, but deals in many other lines. It is said if the firm enters business here it will conduct a complete department store.

city. It is one of the cleanest, one of the prettiest villages—excuse me, I mis-spoke myself—one of the prettiest little cities that I have ever seen. I think," he said, when some one near him made a remark about the Southern Oregon city, "that this city is a great deal better than Medford. It has better opportunities. Medford is over-boomed. The soil we find here is much better, there is more rainfall, and everything seems to be greener and further along. Next to Portland Eugene, in my opinion, is growing faster than any other city in the West." (Mr. Benjamin traveled over this same territory four years ago and has noted its growth.)

The difference between this growth and that of Medford is that the latter seems to be filled with boomers and "tent" men, and there is nothing substantial to their claims, as there is here.

"A large number of us have already bought property in this valley and more will, later. We are only looking now. Do you know that the Oregonians do not know what they have here? It's one of the best localities there is. It's getting the newer element who know how to farm on a scientific basis, and will make this one of the best places in the world."

PORTLAND MARKET REPORT

Portland, Or., June 30.—Confident that wheat prices are now firmly established on an upward swing, a considerable speculative demand has developed on the part of dealers in this market and on the Sound. They are having no success in getting wheat, however, for the same speculative spirit prevails in the country, and holders have withdrawn offering. There were bids yesterday at 84 1/2c for bluestem, but even a figure higher by several cents would have had no effect on the part of farmers and other holders.

The grain buying has been checked the advance in the market, but local dealers expect it to be resumed soon, as they do not see much chance of the market receding. The bulk of the South are supposed to require a considerable amount of grain for the month, in the aggregate, and it has been heavy, as is shown by the large amount of wheat going down the coast.

In other respect steamer market shows no local cereal in barley and oats. Interest and prices are about a minimum. Flour is quoted wholly nominal. The advance in wheat in view of the offering for hops is.

state yesterday and refused. Crop reports from the country were, in the main, favorable.

A cable received from Belgium said rice were increasing in that country and conditions were unfavorable, while elsewhere on the continent conditions were favorable. A London cable said the English crop was looking good, but there was a little vermin.

New York crop conditions are reported by the Waterville Times, of June 24, as follows:

Hops are making good progress these days of ideal weather and the vines are clean and healthy looking. Most growers feel pretty well satisfied with their progress, the old yards being the only ones from which we hear any complaints and this is chiefly on account of the unevenness of the vine. The market still holds firm and steady, with a good demand and with few, if any, transactions.

All Country Produce Steady

In general country produce today was steady at the prices that prevailed yesterday, both the supply and demand being moderate and about balanced. Veal, if at all changed, was a shade firmer, a few sales of extra grade stock at better than 11 cents a pound being reported. Dressed pork held unchanged.

Poultry bids fair to hold at or near the present prices throughout the week, unless receipts prove heavier than are expected. Active trade in hens and chickens is not expected until tomorrow or Thursday.

Eastern stock continues the chief factor in the egg market, and the prices at which they sell affects the movement to a considerable extent of Oregon. In some quarters the latter are reported to be accumulating, but not as yet in a very serious way. Quotations were unchanged.

Changes in Bean Prices

Bean prices show some changes. With the more liberal offerings of white beans the price has dropped here to 5 1/2c while large whites are higher and firmer at 4 7/8c a pound. The decline in small whites is due, in a measure, to the liberal imports of Michigan beans this season because of the holding of small whites by the growers. These took the place of the small whites. All other bean prices are firm.

Loganberries are Slashed

While some sales of loganberries were made as low as \$1 a crate along the street during the past 24 hours, the general price for good quality ranges between \$1.25 and \$1.35 a crate. It is stated that growers can get better returns than \$1 by sending their fruit to the dryers where the dried logans are quoted at 22 1/2c a pound.

Portland Livestock Market

Portland, Or., June 29.—Hogs continued firm at \$10 today with small arrivals, but other lines of livestock were weak.

Sheep market was especially weak.

Lamb were sold this morning up to \$7.75, while ordinary sorts went at \$4.25. Except in the cattle market, the runs were small during the day.
