BIG TIMBER DEAL WHO WILL GET 5TH STREET IS THE QUESTION BY PREMATURE BLAST FROM DENMARK IN OREGON

Cottage Grove, July 16.—One of the largest timber deals consummated in this section of Oregon was consummated yesterday, when A. L. Woodard transferred to J. H. Chambers of this city 20,000,000 feet of timber located five miles south of town, the sawmill at Latham, with a capacity of 40,000 feet per day, and thirty-three acres of millsite land, the consideration being approximately \$50,000. Mr. Chambers will commence logging operations at once, and carry on the work on an extensive scale. The persons controlling the water right on the Coast Fork river have entered into an agreement not to interfere with the logging while the timber is being conveyed to the mill. Mr. Woodard has recently constructed a dam on the river, and has a logging road into the timber, making it possible to conveniently handle the logs. The mill has been idle during the past three months on account of the fact that the dam on a logging road, but will resume within a few days and run to its fullest capacity. Mr. Chambers has large timber holdings in the immediate neighborhood of this newly acquired timber, and eventually this will also be sawed at this mill.

Who will get the railroad franchise over West Fifth street? That is the question that is agitating the minds of a good many people of Eugene right now. Some favor granting it to the Oregon Electric for that company's line, the other for the city, while there are others who are not in favor of granting it to either for the reason that the Lane County Asset Co. now holds a franchise over one block of the street, from Williamette to Olive.

Hunt's camp on the line of the Southern Pacific company's Natron extension, are at the General hospital in this city suffering from serious wounds as a result of a premature explosion of a blast of dynamite at the camp above Lowell Saturday afternoon at 11 o'clock. The men had just lighted the fuse of the blast when it went off much before they expected it to, catching them close at hand. When the dust and smoke of the explosion had cleared away their fellow workmen expected to find them blown to pieces and were surprised to find them still alive, but pretty badly mangled.

In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Lane County. H. A. Souths and John F. Allan, plaintiffs, vs. H. A. Souths, H. D. Edwards and H. M. Price as County Commissioners of Lane County, Oregon, et al. Defendants.

In the name of the state of Oregon you are hereby required to appear and answer the complaint filed against you in the above entitled suit within six weeks from the date of the first publication of this summons, or within six weeks from the date of the service of this summons upon you, if personally served upon you without the state of Oregon, and if you fail to so appear and answer the complaint, for want thereof plaintiffs aforesaid will apply to the court aforesaid for the relief prayed for therein, and will for that purpose set forth the nature of your claim and to the following described premises: The west half of the northwest quarter of the southeast quarter of Section 16, Township 29 South, Range 3 West of W.
