OVER 1500 PUPILS IN SCHOOLS FIRST DAY

"Things are starting out in very good shape," said Superintendent Stockton today, in regard to the opening of the Eugene schools. Because of late hopping and other interferences, the attendance is not larger than it was last year at the end of the first day, but considering all, the outlook is exceptionally good.

Generally conditions are very good. Some of the rooms are badly crowded, having between 40 and 50 pupils each, but it is thought that this can be readily adjusted by changing the school boundaries. It is no one of the grades that is crowded, but a room here and there. But these figures on attendance will be very much larger at the end of the first week. This is usually the case, but there are more reasons than ordinarily this year, because of the combination of circumstances that vary from hopping to the county fair. It is quite possible that the attendance will be swelled to nearly 2000.

In the six schools there are 62 teachers. This shows an increase of 50 per cent in two years. A new addition to the schools this year is the kindergarten that is to be conducted by Miss Murphy in the Central school building. It is a private affair this year, but it is planned to soon make it a part of the public school system.

It is in the High school that the best showing has been made, and here there is an enrollment for the first day of 376 against a first day's enrollment last year of 365. Considering circumstances this is very good and the total attendance this year should be well along toward 500. There are 17 teachers to handle the six courses.

One thing noticeable this fall is the large number of students from outside schools, there being 44 so far. There are over 100 freshmen from the eighth grades of the county. The freshman total at noon was 145. The students are divided among the schools as follows: High, 376; Central, 264; Geary, 265; Patterson, 221; and Condon, 124.
