LAUNCH THAT CARRIED EXPLOSIVE TO BLOW UP LOS ANGELES NEWSPAPER IS LOCATED

Oakland, Cal., Oct. 4.—Answering perfectly the description of the launch "Peerless," which is supposed to have carried the dynamite used to blow up the Los Angeles Times building from Giant, the launch "Pastime" was discovered in Oakland harbor today.

Search Is Widespread. Los Angeles, Oct. 4.—Search for the dynamites who destroyed the Times building Saturday embraces all the country between San Francisco and San Diego, and from the ocean to the deserts east of San Joaquin.
