TEACHERS' EXAMINATION.

A Large Crowd of Prospective Pedagogues in Attendance.

There is always a large number of applicants for teachers' certificates at the spring examination and this one is no exception, in fact the number is larger this spring than usual.

For county teachers' certificates there are all told 87 applicants—65 ladies and 22 gentlemen.

For state certificates there are 7 applicants at this time.

There are also 3 applicants for state diplomas.

Superintendent Stevenson is assisted in conducting the examination by Attorney J. M. Williams and Miss Mary E. McCormack, his regular assistants.

The number of applicants is larger at this time than at the spring examination of 1894.

ANOTHER FIRE AT SILVER LAKE.—Private letters received state that on the 4th inst. the house of Mr. Busick at Silver Lake, with its contents, was entirely destroyed by fire.

Mr. Busick was not at home when the fire occurred. A daughter who was injured in the big Christmas fire had not yet recovered and another daughter was ill from exposure at that time. These were rescued by the family but all their belongings were lost, leaving them without shelter and entirely destitute.

Steps were at once taken to relieve their temporary needs. Of those injured in the big fire, Geo. Payne is still in a very critical condition, Mrs. LaBrie and others were improving slowly, and some had entirely recovered.

HORSES IN DEMAND.—Salem Journal: O. H. Holcomb, of Seattle, shipped a car load of draft horses from Salem and also a car load from Albany on Sunday last. R. H. Westcott is instrumental in bringing this business to Salem and is creating quite a market for good horses. Persons having horses of 1600 pounds or over will do well to see him.
